1-3 cup orange juice  
Rind of orange (grated)  
1 tsp. almond flavoring  
1 cup sugar  
1 egg  
1 cups flour  
1/4 tsp. soda  
1/4 tsp. salt  
Pkg. mixed glacé fruit  
1 tsp. baking powder  
1/2 cup nuts.

Pour boiling water over butter and add rind, sugar, juice, flavor and egg. Add fruit, nuts and flour.
