Increased Mail Communication.

OTTAWA, Nov. 1. A deputation from Prince Edward Island, yesterday, waited on the members of the Government, asking for increased mail communication between the Island and the mainland.

Gladstone Promises a New Irish Policy.

LONDON, Nov. 1. It is said that Mr. Gladstone has promised to bring forth a fresh scheme for Irish Legislation next session, which will redeem the Parnellist support of the Government. It will embrace a system of peasant proprietorship, the extension of the Franchise, and a local Government for Ireland.

Dufferin's Mission Creates a Sensation.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 1. The mission of Lord Dufferin, British Ambassador to Cairo has caused a great sensation here. The Ministers held a special session and discussed the situation up to a late hour last night.

Parnell's Tenants to be Ejected.

DUBLIN, Nov. 1. At the Session of the Wicklow Court yesterday, the judge granted a writ of ejectment against three of Charles Stewart Parnell's tenants for non-payment of their rents. The tenants were four years in arrears.

England, France and Egypt.

LONDON, Nov. 1. Lord Granville, Foreign Secretary, has made a fresh proposition to France regarding Egypt. It is to the effect that the joint control of Egypt shall be abolished, and a high commissioner appointed by the Khedive.

No Famine in the West of Ireland.

LONDON, Nov. 1. Mr. Trevelyan, Chief Secretary for Ireland, in the Commons to-day denied the statement that a famine existed in the West of Ireland.

Closure.

LONDON, Nov. 1. A meeting of Conservative members was held last night and it was decided to support Sir Stafford Northcote's advice and oppose Closure resolutions to the bitter end.

Severe Storms.

LONDON, Nov. 1. Severe storms continue throughout England and much damage is done to shipping and property on shore.

GENERAL CABLE NEWS.

LONDON, Oct. 30. The Pall Mall Gazette is informed that the Government have decided that Lord Dufferin, British Ambassador at Constantinople, shall go to Cairo for a time to take the direction of negotiations of Egyptian affairs.

ROME, Oct. 30. The elections for members of the new parliament were held yesterday, Signors Depretis, Prime Minister; Baccarini, Minister of Public Works; Baccelli, Minister of Public Instruction, and Zanarilli, Minister of Justice and of Ecclesiastical Affairs, were elected.

NEW YORK, Oct. 30. Richard K. Fox has offered to back Tom Allen, ex-champion pugilist of America, against any pugilist, Sullivan preferred, for \$1,000 to \$2,000 a side.

PARIS, Oct. 30. M. Clemenceau addressed his constituents at the Cirque yesterday. The meeting was a stormy one. M. Fernando Clement, member of the commune, succeeded in preventing a vote of confidence being passed. The meeting is regarded as the opening of a political campaign of the Anarchists against the Bourgeoisie.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 30. Honolulu advices of Oct. 22d state that the British barque "Niagara" was wrecked at the entrance of Honolulu harbor; 400 tons of her cargo of wheat were saved. Five hundred Japanese are expected here the next twelve months; also two thousand Portuguese and one thousand Germans. The coronation will take place Feb. 12th. The sugar crop is estimated at one hundred and fifty million dollars.

VIENNA, Oct. 30. Losses by the recent floods in the Tyrol must be greater than those of September, as the extent of area is much greater.

LONDON, Oct. 30. In the Commons, to-night, many minor amendments to the procedure rules were disposed of. The debate was adjourned. A thousand acres of land in South Lincolnshire were flooded by the recent heavy rains.

MADRID, Oct. 30. The gales of Friday caused great damage to shipping at various ports on the Spanish coast. Twenty-five fishermen and sailors perished in the storm.

PARIS, Oct. 30. Rumors of a great fraud are in circulation this morning. Two Englishmen are said to have passed nearly two million francs of counterfeit English bank notes for French money to bankers and money changers of Paris.

MARSEILLES, Oct. 30. It is reported that the Mayor has received a letter announcing that the Hotel Deville will be blown up on all Saints' day.

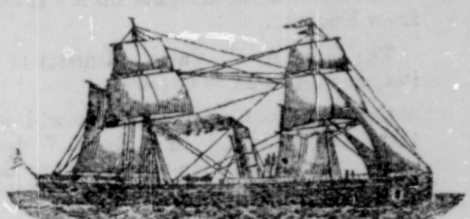

IN THE SUPREME COURT.

In the matter of An Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the forty-fifth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, Chapter 23, intitled, "An Act respecting Insolvent Banks, Insurance Companies, Loan Companies, Building Societies, and Trading Corporations, and of the President, Directors, and Company of the Bank of Prince Edward Island, an Insolvent Banking Company.
