

Student Union President MacDonald Reports On Recent Business

In the next few lines, I'll attempt to explain to you just what has been going on in Student Union up to this point in the school year. During the summer the office was open daily with Mickey Place, our business manager, maintaining regular hours there. Pubs and Pig n' Whistles were operated by the Union for summer students and they were a social, if not a financial success. However, we did break about even.

Last year the cafeteria in the Barn was operated at a cost of about \$3000.00. The reasons for this are many, but the problem has been solved at least temporarily. The cafeteria has been taken over by Nan Younker. Nan has experience in this field, and is a great cook, as well as a great person. The entire staff of the Barn, with the exception of Clyde Bell, will be new to you this year.

The student insurance policy this year is with the Zurich Insurance Company. There is plenty of

information available on just what this health insurance covers. This year a new procedure will be used to gain prescription drugs from the stores. You simply have to take your prescription and your student card to the store. The larger ones (a list will be printed later) will have lists of the students and your student card will be matched against the list. There is no \$1.00 deposit. Because the lists will not be available for about three weeks, the system is not yet in operation. If you do need any prescription drugs before this goes into effect, simply pay for them and take your receipt to the S.U. office.

This year, the opportunity will arise where we can import some good bands, but the cost will be higher. Examples at present are the Downchild Blues Band, who are real fine musicians, but they cost about \$1400.00 per night. An event of this size would have to be held in the gym and would necessitate a \$2.75 - \$3.00 admis-

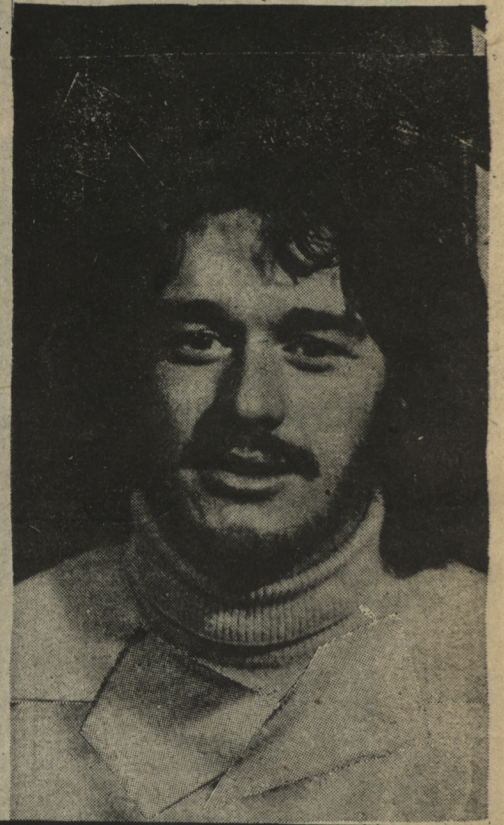
sion price. Another example is John Prine, a well known American singer - musician. He plays for \$2000.00 per concert, which would mean renting Confederation Theatre at Confederation Centre and charging \$4.00 - \$5.00 per ticket. Canadian Conspiracy, Liverpool, Horselips (an Irish rock band) are all in the \$1200.00 - \$1400.00 vicinity, but they are good if you want to pay the price (which is not all that much per person) we could try to arrange for some excellent bands. U.S. CUSTOMS ARREST TWO HORSES FOR DOPE SMUGGLING
