Turkey and Poland Deadlock In Security Council Seat Row By JOSEPH MACSWEEN Canadian Press Staff Writer UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (CP) Turkey and Communist Poland wound up exactly where they started - in deadlock - Tuesday after a two-day battle of the ballots for a seat on the United Nations security council.

The contest was postponed until next Monday at the suggestion of Britain. After the 25th ballot in the 82-nation general assembly, Poland - which has led consistently - had 43 votes compared with 36 for Turkey. That was identical with the figures in Tuesday's initial ballot, the 14th in the series.

Thirteen ballots Monday ended in similar deadlock, with the United States strongly backing Turkey and the Soviet Union equally adamant in its support of Poland for the non-permanent security council seat which will be left vacant by Japan at the end of this year.

NEED TWO-THIRDS A two-thirds majority of those countries voting - abstentions don't count - is necessary for election, Turkey was never able to take the lead. Abstentions ranged between one and two. Canadian delegates declined to disclose their stand in the secret balloting, but they are on record as saying that they hope the election will be kept out of the cold war arena. The consensus among observers is that Canada's vote went to Poland.

Canada's effort to keep another subject - its proposal for a world-wide study of radiation - out of the cold war ran into an apparent snag Tuesday when Czechoslovakia put forward a somewhat similar but much more limited draft resolution for a study of radioactive fallout.

The Czech resolution urged the UN scientific committee to devote more attention in future to the complex problems of fallout. It urged particular attention to the biological and genetic effects.

STILL UNDECIDED OTTAWA (CP) - The Canadian government still has not made up its mind whether to set some of its surplus butter to Britain. But informants said Friday that if it does decide to do so, it likely will ship between 10,000,000 and 20,000,000 pounds.

APPLEBY, Eng. (CP) - This Westmorland town has been granted a new coat of arms. The grant was made after the council found the device the town has used since the 13th century infringing the rights of others.

PARIS (AP) - Premier Michel Debre warned Tuesday that Algeria's right to choose its own future must respect French strategic and economic interests. While ensuring the return of the rule of law in Algeria, France has the right to set certain limits, he told the national assembly.

These legitimate limits are clear, Debre said. They are those which are imposed by respect for the fundamental rights of the French nation. We have in the Mediterranean, in North Africa, in the Sahara, interests which are fundamental to the point that their respect is a condition of the national future.

France could not permit the western Mediterranean to become a threatening sea, he said. BACK ECONOMIES Nor was it possible to put in jeopardy the great efforts made by France and Frenchmen to develop the riches of the Sahara for the good of the French and North African economies, the premier added.

"Secession in drawing the Algerians toward dictatorship, despotism and racism, would be the negation of law," Debre declared. "If it is for the Algerians to make this choice themselves, France and the government have the duty to prove to all... why the maintenance of their close union with France itself is the first condition for a free and great future."

Debre's speech on government policy was received coldly at first by the deputies, then with occasional moderate applause. President Charles de Gaulle has offered Algeria a choice of referendum of integration with France, a partnership in the French community or full independence - after peace is restored.

NO EVIDENCE LONDON (AP) - The foreign office said Tuesday there is no evidence to confirm reports that a wanted Gestapo chief is hiding in British-protected Kuwait. The former German SS leader, Adolf Eichmann, has been described by Israel radio as the head of the "Jewish extermination department in the Nazi regime. In that role, he was said to have been responsible for the massacre of millions of European Jews.

QUEBEC (CP) - Field Marshal Earl Alexander of Tunis and Lady Alexander arrived here Tuesday from Europe on the liner Sylvania for a week's stay in Canada. They immediately drove to Arvida 110 miles north of here where Lord Alexander, a former Canadian governor-general, will attend the quarterly meeting of the board of the Aluminum Company of Canada of which he is a director. They will later fly to Ottawa to visit Maj.-Gen. Georges Vanier, present governor-general.
