

China's Policy Seen Dangerous

MOSCOW (AP)—The Soviet Communist party said here China's anti-Soviet and international policies have entered "a new, dangerous phase" and are damaging world communism while helping the West.

At the same time, the party, which runs the Soviet Union, renewed the Soviet pledge to help North Vietnam and pushed ahead plans for a world Communist meeting, which Peking opposes.

These developments were disclosed in a resolution adopted by a two-day meeting of the

party's central committee, the main deliberative body.

The resolution unanimously endorsed a report made to the committee by General Secretary Leonid I. Brezhnev.

CHINA KEY TOPIC

Most of the meeting seemed to have been devoted to China, the main foreign policy problem now facing the Kremlin.

In the last month Russia has stepped up its propaganda attacks, giving its moral support to opponents of Communist party Chairman Mao Tse-tung in the power struggle in China.

The Soviet Communist party also has been trying to organize a meeting of world Communist parties to adopt a new policy line.

The "new, dangerous stage" of Chinese policy was defined as "the course promoted by the present leaders of the CPC (Communist party of China) in the international arena. Its policy in respect of Socialist (Communist) countries, the hostile campaign against our party and the Soviet people and the splitting activities in the international Communist movement."

"All this has nothing in common with Marxism-Leninism. Vietnam was dealt with briefly."

Movie Actor Passes Draft

NEW YORK (AP)—Movie actor George Hamilton, a frequent escort of Lynda Bird Johnson, daughter of the U.S. president, has passed his draft physical and the results show he is "qualified for military service," draft officials said here.

Hamilton, 27, has declared his willingness to fight in the Vietnam war. He is expected to spend Christmas with the presidential family.

The meeting "considers it necessary to continue all-round support to the heroic struggle of the Vietnamese people against the criminal aggression of U.S. imperialism,"

however, Col. Arthur Alpert, an aide to the director of selective service in New York, said: "The results have nothing to do with his present deferment. They mean his draft board has more information to act on if they reclassify him."

The actor had received a 3-A "hardship" deferment on the ground that he is his mother's sole support.

Scores of persons in the U.S. have protested that his mother, Anne Foster Hamilton Hunt Spaulding, lives in a 28-room Beverly Hills, Calif., mansion and that she has two other grown sons who are not listed among her supporters.

Hamilton, 27, has declared his willingness to fight in the Vietnam war. He is expected to spend Christmas with the presidential family.

B.C. Bank Bill Becomes Law

OTTAWA (CP)—After more than two years of parliamentary delays, the private bill to incorporate the Bank of British Columbia became law Wednesday.

The measure received royal assent from Chief Justice Robert Taschereau, acting as deputy to the Governor-General shortly after the Senate concurred with a amendment passed earlier by the Commons.

The new bank will have its headquarters in Vancouver and will be headed by Einar Gunderson, a former member of the B.C. cabinet and the chief fundraiser for the Social Credit party of Premier Bennett.

Wanted Man Is Captured

OTTAWA (CP)—Lep Robert Prest, 26, high on Quebec's list of most-wanted men, has been captured without a struggle by Ottawa police who surrounded a trailer in a camp in Eastview on the city's eastern fringe.

Ottawa detectives Tom Flanagan and David Clancy entered the trailer as fellow officers from the Ottawa and Eastview forces stood guard outside. A revolver was found in the trailer but Prest made no effort to use it. Prest appeared in magistrate's court a few hours later and was remanded to Dec. 19 on a charge of illegal possession of an offensive weapon.

Prest and Alfred Berthelotte, 34, have been sought since their escape Sept. 21 from the jail at Campbell's Bay, Que., where they had been taken to give evidence in another case.

In Montreal provincial police said Berthelotte and Prest ranked fifth and sixth on their list of most-wanted men. Berthelotte is still at large.

MINI-SKIRTS PLAN REVOLT

LONDON (AP)—Two secretaries in the House of Lords have refused to comply with ban on mini-skirts.

The order against mini-skirts was issued by Euan Graham, 42, secretary to the chairman of committees, Lord peer Earl Listowel, 60.

"Mr. Graham asked us not to show so much leg," said Virginia Moody, Lord Listowel's 20-year-old secretary in an interview. "I gathered the original complaint came from one or more peers, but we can not find out who complained."

"I can't think who objected. Certainly not Lord Listowel. They are not at all fuddy-duddy in the House of Lords. We were simply asked to lengthen our mini-skirts—but we are not going to do it. We are rebelling. The peers do not seem to mind; some of them have come up to us and said they will support our revolt."

There are about 15 female secretaries in the House of Lords. But only Miss Moody and her friend, Patricia Reid, 29, who also works in the records office, wear mini-skirts.
