Immigration Encouragement Pays Dividends Says Author

Canada's Immigration Policy as its title suggests, is for the serious reader. F.avid C. Corbett, assistant professor of political science at the University of British Columbia, has made a comprehensive study of the subject and finds much to criticize.

His 200-page book is published by University of Toronto Press under auspices of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs.

Dr. Corbett concludes that there are good economic reasons for encouraging immigration despite objections to it from some segments of the population.

"A large inflow of immigrants, say 200,000 per year, if well timed and well planned, should bring economic benefits. It should also help in a small way to acquire our obligation, as a wealthy nation, to help others. A large-scale immigration program should produce other non-economic benefits as well."

But he expresses concern that there may be international grievances against Canada because of the way immigration policy is carried out. He is troubled particularly by the amount of authority delegated to individual immigration officers and what he considers the looseness of regulations that determine who may be admitted to the country.

He contends that immigration detail should be discussed more openly in parliament and that the government should make available more information about its policy.

PICTURE OF CANADA A panorama of Canadian life is given by Jean Bruchesi in Canada (Ryerson), but the accent is on French-speaking Canada.

This is a translation of the book which Mr. Bruchesi, member of the Royal Society of Canada and under-secretary of the province of Quebec since 1937, wrote in French at the suggestion of Fernand Nathan of Paris for the collection Merveilles de la France et du Monde.

It is well produced, illustrated with a wealth of attractive and well-documented photographs presenting a graphic picture of life in Canada, particularly in the province of Quebec.

The text, a brief 47 pages, starts when Jacques Cartier sailed up the St. Lawrence River in 1535 - when Canada signified only the country between Quebec City and Trois Rivieres. Then it takes the reader through the highlights of the Dominion's history and ends with a short discussion on Canada's place in the world today and the development of her dual culture.

Icebreakers Have Worked St. Lawrence For Past 50 Years

CRUISER RIVIERES, Que., (CP) - Long before spring breezes warm the St. Lawrence River valley, steel-nosed ice-breakers work to clear giant ice - fields from the shipping channel.

Their aim is to break up ice-jams that could cause flooding in low-lying areas and to have the Quebec-Montreal channel open by late February or early March.

Ocean-going ships sometimes use the channel as early as the middle of March.

This year the ice-breakers d'Ilberville and the Ernest Lapointe reached a point near Montreal last week and started the last phase of their work.

Two months earlier the transport department vessels had started their upstream journey from Quebec.

The policy of giving nature a hand in clearing the river was first inaugurated about 50 years ago. Then an ice - breaker was posted at Quebec Bridge to keep the narrows clear.

News Commentator Dies Unexpectedly

OTTAWA (CP) - Larry Martin, news commentator for Ottawa radio station, CKOY, died in the main block of the Parliament buildings Thursday while preparing his account of Finance Minister Harris' budget.

While locked in the Commons' railway committee room with other reporters privileged to have advance copies of the budget, the 44-year-old Mr. Martin suffered a seizure and died.

Mr. Martin, native of Ottawa, had been 20 years in radio.

Survivors include his widow and one brother.

Decide Against Putting Three Whooping Cranes Together

By GEORGE KITCHN WASHINGTON (CP) - The world's whooping crane population soon may be increased—if all goes well at the Audubon Park Zoo in New Orleans within the next few weeks.

Crip, one of three whooping cranes in captivity and 72 known to be in existence, is staging an occasional mating dance.

His mate, Josephine, still is coy, but in past years she has been congenial.

The report on Crip and Josephine was made by Frederick C. Lincoln, of the United States fish and wildlife service, at a meeting here of the whooping crane advisory group, made up of Canadian and American conservation and government officials whose aim is to save the few remaining cranes from extinction.

HOPFUL SIGNS Lincoln reported that he visited the cranes two weeks ago and found them in "excellent condition." He was encouraged at the prospects for progeny.

"We are going to get an aviculturist to help the cranes through the critical nesting period," Lincoln said. Last year, Josephine hatched two young whoopers but both died.

The group also considered the problem of mate for another captive whooping crane, of undetermined sex, in the zoo at San Antonio, Tex. Suggested as a possible partner was an errant crane which stayed in Texas last summer when the rest of the world's only known crane migrated to Northern Canada.

Another proposal to transfer the San Antonio crane to the New Orleans zoo to join the two already there was quickly vetoed.

"It's a mistake to put three birds together," suggested Clark Cottom, former assistant director of the wildlife service. "Two's a company and three's a crowd in the breeding season."

Sees Threat To N. S. Deer Herd

HALIFAX (CP) - A Progressive Conservative from Digby said in the legislature Thursday that Nova Scotia may lose its deer herd unless something is done fast.

M. S. Leonard urged the government to "do something fast" or else "we will lose this big business." He said that when 50,000 licenses are issued annually deer hunting must be classed as a big business.

Speaking in the throne speech debate, Mr. Leonard said he had discussed the situation with many "sincere" guides and they all expressed grave concern over diminishing deer herds.

"I am satisfied with the opinions of these guides," he said, and "I ask the minister of lands and forests to take heed of this suggestion before it's too late."

If the minister is not prepared to change his mind, "then something else must be done." This, he said, could be the appointment of a commission which would make a thorough study of the situation and talk to all experienced guides.
