THE COWARDLY CHINESE.
They Fleed Without Fighting, Throwing Away Their Arms and Drums.

A despatch dated Kulienciao, November 3, says: After the capture of Kulienciao, on the 26th ult., the Japanese headquarters were moved from Wipao to this point. Two columns chased the Chinese to Salo and attacked Andon. The Chinese fled without fighting, throwing away their arms and drums in their flight. General Tatum started for Fong Wong on the 27th and arrived there on the 31st ult. The garrison made no show of a fight and fled toward the main body as soon as the Japanese appeared. The principal generals are proceeding with troops toward Munkien. The inhabitants of Hsi Chiao and Takosin complain bitterly of the violence of the Chinese soldiers, from whom they suffered constantly during their occupation. They are very friendly to the Japanese. At present the Japanese are taking no prisoners. Three hundred Chinese bodies were found after the capture of Kulienciao. Many of them died of wounds received in previous battles. By the capture of Fong Wong the Japanese come in possession of 36 cannon, 20,000 rounds ammunition, 1,500 muskets, 200,000 cartridges and an enormous quantity of small arms supplies. Major-General Yamagata has ordered that all labor and supplies be paid for as obtained by the Japanese. Consequently the inhabitants of the country volunteer the services and gifts to the Japanese. They are very friendly to the Japanese. Several European war-ships are cruising near Port Arthur, waiting for the expected battle.
