

Red China Ultimatum Seer Given to Russians

By ADAM KELLETT-LONG PEKING (Reuters) The Chinese Communist Party issued Sunday what observers said amounts to an ultimatum to the Soviet Communist party and its followers to change their attitude about Yugoslav "revisionism" or cause a complete split in the international Communist movement.
