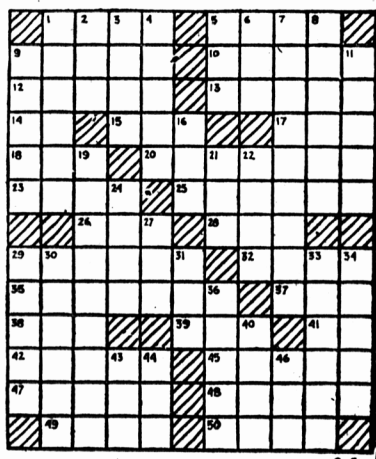
CARLETON MISSION BAND
