Young Canadian Pianist Is Romantic Interpreter

Sheila Henig, a lovely young Canadian pianist hailed as a musically interpreter by the Toronto Star, will perform here Sunday evening with the Atlantic Orchestra in the third of the Charlottetown Festival's summer concerts.

Critics in Holland, where the young pianist gave several concerts, lauded her as a fine interpreter of romantic music.

Sheila Henig will play five selections by Brahms - Ballade in G Minor, Romance in F Major, Capriccio in B Minor, Intermezzo in E Flat Minor, Chopin's Fantasia in F Minor and Debussy's Estampes on the first half of the program.

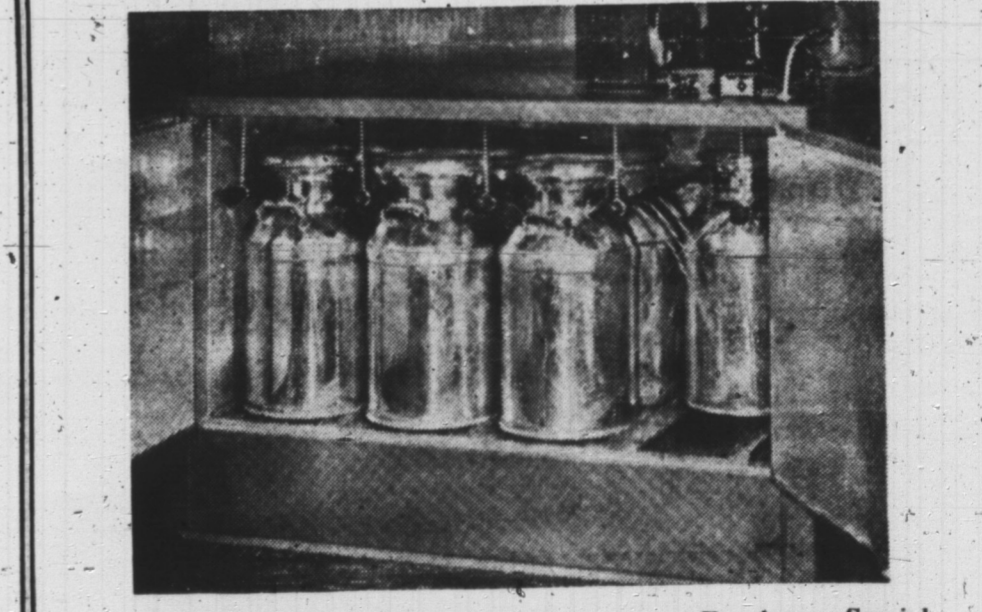
