## \$1 OR ONE DAY.

A Punishment That No Man Need Fear In Gotham's Police Courts.

If any respectable person should happen to get into the hands of the police and be fined by a city magistrate, when he had no money and didn't want to make known his plight to friends, he might be benefited by knowing that some threatened terms of imprisonment are not so awful as they seem to be. This is due to the fact that the day of commitment and the day of discharge always count in law as full days, and that it is the custom not to put a person to serving out a sentence until the end of the day of commitment and to release him on the morning of the day of discharge.

A curious instance of how this works was witnessed the other day at the Charles Street police station. A reporter had gone there upon some news errand, and while he talked to the sergeant at the desk he noticed that the main room was nearly filled with push carts.

"We have had to make a raid upon a lot of poor fellows," explained the sergeant.

Just then a policeman came in with two vendors and reported at the desk.

"They were all fined \$1 each or one day," he said, referring to the batch of push cart men that he had taken to court.

"These two men paid their fines and have come back with me to get their carts."

"All right," said the sergeant. "Get some men from the back room and help them out with the carts."

While the carts were got out the sergeant glanced up at the clock.

"It's after 4," he said. "All the rest of them will be here in a minute or two. You'd better stay and be ready to help them out with the rest of the carts."

"You see," continued the sergeant to the reporter, "these two men who paid their fines have saved only a few minutes, and if they had not been greenhorns they would have kept their money. The others, I guess, have been there before. The official day in court ends at 4 o'clock, when the court adjourns, and all the prisoners who have been fined \$1 or committed for one day are released. It's time for the others to be here now."

Sure enough, as he spoke they came trooping in. They were smiling, and they glanced with quizzical looks at the men who had paid their fines and were going down the street.—New York Sun.

**Anesthetics.** The use of anesthetics in surgical operations has made this a new world. The recent commemoration of the employment of ether to deaden pain inevitable to surgery emphasized this fact anew. But what heroism, now seen to be unnecessary, was displayed when patients had to face the terrors of operations! Almost two centuries and a half ago an Englishman, visiting Paris, saw an operation involving a risk to life performed on a child 10 or 9 years old. She "underwent the operation with most extraordinary patience" and expressed "great joy" when she saw it was over. We can well understand the joy, but the patience seems almost incredible to a generation which escapes so much pain through the immeasurable mercy of discoveries that banish suffering.—Youth's Companion.

**How Money Grows.** How money accumulates in a generation is shown by the increase of the fund of \$650,000 left in 1877 by Allen C. Lewis of Chicago to found a free technical college in that city. His will provided that the money should be invested until it reached an amount that would insure a good building and the support of the college. By November, 1895, the endowment had been swelled to \$1,600,000, and in September, 1896, the institute was opened.

The ivory market at Antwerp, organized scarcely five years ago, has become the largest one in the world—larger than the two other great markets, that of London and that of Liverpool.

An international exhibition of gastronomy and of culinary art is to take place at Vienna in 1898 in honor of the fiftieth anniversary of the reign of the emperor of Austria-Hungary.

**McMillan & Hornsby's FOR WALL PAPER** A By-law for allowing a Rate of Discount on the Assessments on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general civic purposes for the current year ending the thirty-first day of December A. D. 1897. Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:— 1st. A discount at the rate of Two and One-half Per Cent shall be allowed to all taxpayers who shall, on or before the Fifteenth day of July next, A. D. 1897, pay to the City Clerk, at his office, the taxes severally due by them for the current year on Real Estate and Personal Property for civic purposes. (Sgd.) W. E. D. 1897, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate, as assessed by the Assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property liable to taxation in said City, and of all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein, made and duly returned by them on the fourth day of March, A. D. 1897. 2nd. The rate of assessment on Personal Property for such general civic purposes, for the year commencing the first day of January, A. D. 1897, and ending the thirty-first day of December, A. D. 1897, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the Assessors of the said City in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll, made and duly returned by them as aforesaid. A By-Law for Levying and Specifying the Rate of Assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property and Poll in the City of Charlottetown for a Waterworks Fund, under Statute 50th Victoria, Chapter 8. Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:— 1st. The rate of Assessment on Real Estate for a Waterworks Fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January, A. D. 1897, and ending the thirty-first day of December, A. D. 1897, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one-eighth of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the Assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the general Assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property liable to taxation in said City, and all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein made and duly returned by them on the fourth day of March, A. D. 1897. 2nd. The rate of Assessment on Personal Property for such Water Works Fund for the year commencing the first day of January, A. D. 1897, and ending the thirty-first day of December, A. D. 1897, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one-eighth of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the Assessors of the said City in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll, made and duly returned by them as aforesaid. 3rd. The amount of Poll Tax to be paid by every person returned by the said Assessors in said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll as liable thereto for such Water works Fund under said Statute, for the year commencing the first day of January, A. D. 1897, and ending the thirty-first day of December, A. D. 1897, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one cent on every person so assessed and returned as aforesaid. (Sgd.) W. E.
