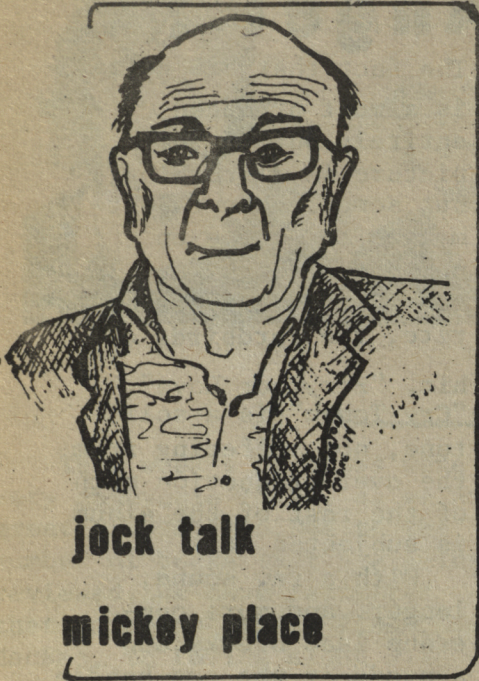


proud weekend for being a panther

Our football heroes won their fourth game of the season & our hockey gladiators skated off with two wins & top honours in the Panther Booster Club Invitational Tournament.

In Football, early in the first quarter we gave up a field goal to Dal but we rebounded quickly as Rick Kiraly passed to Socky MacDonald twice in succession for long gains & then went over the goal line himself with a keeper from the 12. In the second quarter Souris' gift to UPEI sport, Ernie Gallant, added to the lead when he made a spectacular open field 45 yard run. We would have liked to have seen just one more play in the second quarter as Kiraly had just carried to the Dal 3 on a long run, that was stopped by a desperate tackle, but the gun went off & the teams went to their mid-game rest with the score 14-3. Early in the third, a long Kiraly pass was caught by Terry Kennedy on the Dal 10 & two plays later Larry Gallant went over for the final Panther major counter to put the game out of Dal reach, although they did manage another T.D. & made threatening gestures that were foiled by our outstanding defence squad and the game ended 21-10. In the play of the game Ernie Gallant gained 105 yards in 12 carries & Larry Gallant, 84 yards in 9. (We wonder how many will know our meaning when we comment that the Haches should be proud of Ernie & Larry.) Dal gained 178 yards through passes and 109 by Panther penalties but only 10 yards on the ground. This certainly says a lot for our defence which was really terrific, particularly in the late stages when they successfully frustrated two Dal series

of plays from within our 15 yard line. They also "Dunked" Dal quarterbacks 5 times. Mike Lyriotokis, in particular, spent so much time in the Dalhousie backfield that he sometimes seemed reluctant to return to his position for lining up for play. What was the use? He was coming right back as soon as the ball was snapped. For the last game of the season, on 13 Nov., here at MacAdam field, we will welcome St. F.X. who already boast of a narrow 29-20 victory over the Panthers earlier in the season. The winner will be next year's "Wild Card" team. The recipient of the honour(?) will replace U.N.B who will be stepping up to Division A. Beat X! Beat X! Beat X! In hockey, our Panthers must be making mainland critics, who had relegated them to a 5th place struggle with Dal, start to re-assess their evaluations. We disposed of a rugged Memorial Beothuk team 6-1 & trimmed Dal, with ease, 7-2 in the final. Pick-up where he left off last year, Lennie Kelly potted 3 goals, was credited with a couple of assists & was a unanimous choice as Right Wing on the All Star Team as well as its Most Valuable Player. Other Panthers who got All Star rating were Ken Burton for Left Wing and Bob Mitchell for Defence. Besides Lennie's 3, other Panther scores went to Mike Selleck, Doug MacLean, Ken Burton & Dave Cameron all of whom had two while singles went to Gerry McCarron & Russel Doyle. Next action will

be with U.N.B. at the Forum for two this weekend and, before we have our next issue, next Wednesday night the fast skating & highly rated Bleu Aigles from U. de Moncton will be with us. They always bring a loud enthusiastic group of fans with them so lets all go to the Forum. We hate to be outshouted in our own hometown. Vince Mulligan & his Soccer Team visited Memorial over the weekend & dropped a pair to the nationally rated Newfoundlanders. They did, enjoy the trip and we, think, have much to be proud of with their 3 wins in 1976 & Vincie looks forward to the 1977 season. We will call your attention to, & solicit your support for, several projects that the Basketball Team is arranging in an effort to raise funds so that they may engage in a Montreal Tournament & then fly back to Acadia, for the Tip-off Tournament. Hopefully, they'll be a bright picture on our 1977 sports scene so give the boys a hand! There's always some bad news. We learn, with regret, that Dave MacNeil, longtime conditioner of Panther Teams & a friend to everyone who has played for UPEI, has accepted employment elsewhere.
