THE MASTER FISHERMAN

Call it luck or what you will, fish are mostly caught through skill.

In winter when the Big River freezes which do not freeze. Long ago Blacky the Crow discovered that sometimes food, such as it is, is washed up on the ice of the shore along these open places. Sometimes it is a dead fish. Some one else has discovered this too. It is King Eagle, he of the snowy white head and the white tail. This morning King Eagle wasn't around and Blacky was glad of that. Blacky has a lot of respect for King Eagle.

He was Little Joe Otter. When Blacky saw Little Joe's brown head appear above the water he knew right away that there was little chance for the other fishermen. Contract Bridge

FATAL DELAY

Under most circumstances a finesse should be delayed as long as possible, because something may arise to make it unnecessary. Sometimes, however, delay is fatal—as in the following case.

West dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.

♠ K 3 2, ♠ A 7, ♠ 4 2, ♠ 10 7 6 5 4 3, ♠ Q 7 8 4, ♠ 10 9 8 5 4, ♠ 5 3, ♠ 7 3, ♠ A Q J 9, ♠ A J 9 5, ♠ 6, ♠ A K Q J 10 6, ♠ 8 2

The bidding:
West North East South
1♥ Pass 2♥ Dble.
3♥ 3NT 4♥ 5♦
Pass Pass Pass

North's three-notrump call was certainly not conservative but he felt that his holding warranted some action, and he naturally didn't have much hope of making five clubs. In any case, this encouraged South did not hesitate to bid five diamonds over East's four hearts. Incidentally, East was a very good guesser when he refused to let North play three notrump—that contract would have been cold. So was the five-diamond contract, in a manner of speaking, but at least South couldn't "lay the hand down" for 11 tricks.

West opened the heart king. Dummy's ace was put in, and South quickly drew the opponents' trumps. He then led the spade five to the king and finessed successfully against the spade queen. This, however, did not save him from having to concede a spade trick, and since he also had to lose two clubs, the contract became hopeless.

Now observe the great difference it would have made if South, who could see the need for the spade finesse right from the start, had taken that finesse immediately, after dummy won the first trick with the heart ace! With the spade jack holding, declarer would then draw trumps after which he would lead the spade five to the king, dropping West's ten and establishing a second finessing position against East's Q-7, up to his own A-9. In short, the best development of the spade suit demanded that South should not waste dummy's first-trick entry, the heart ace, which in effect was what he did when he started right in to draw trumps.

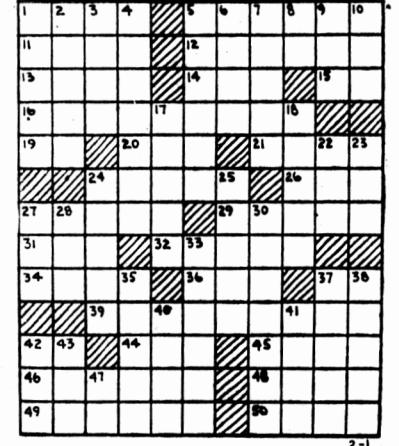

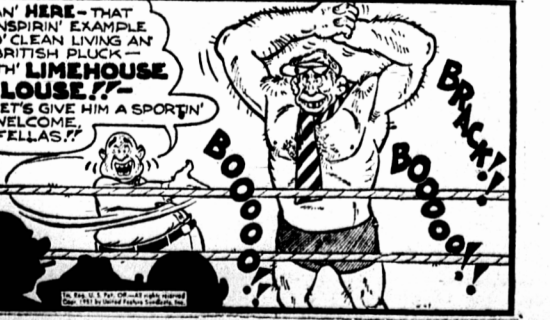

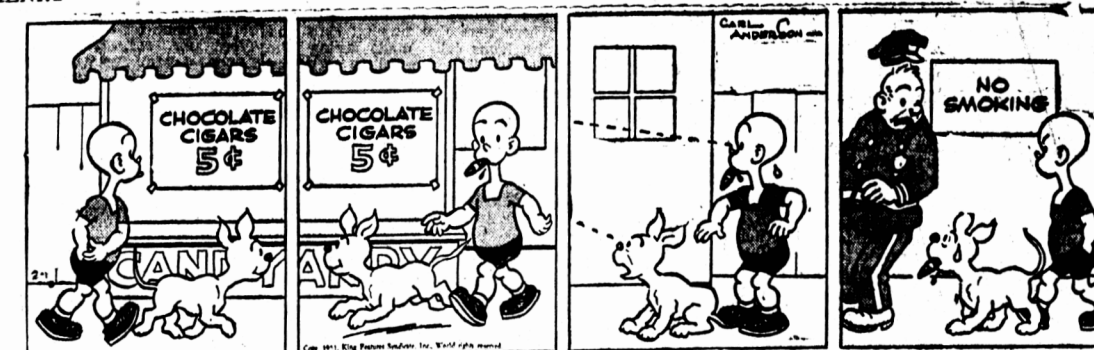
