**THE GANDALF SCHOLARSHIP**  
 Any student completing the second-last year of a recognized degree program at a Canadian University which includes

sufficient course study in one or more of physics, engineering or the computing sciences, and who, upon completion of a degree program would be eligible to enter the data communications field at a technical level, is eligible to apply for a Gandalf Scholarship. Gandalf offers the successful applicant salaried employment with the company's engineering group in Ottawa, during the summer preceding the final year of study. As well, the scholarship will pay the tuition fees for the final year in an undergraduate degree program, up to but not exceeding \$1200.00
