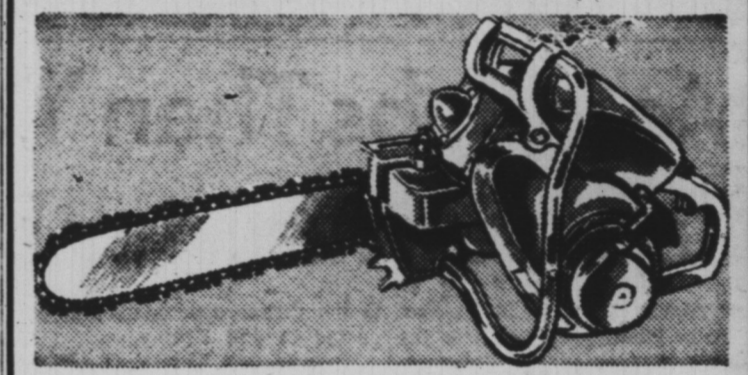

ONTARIO CAPITAL

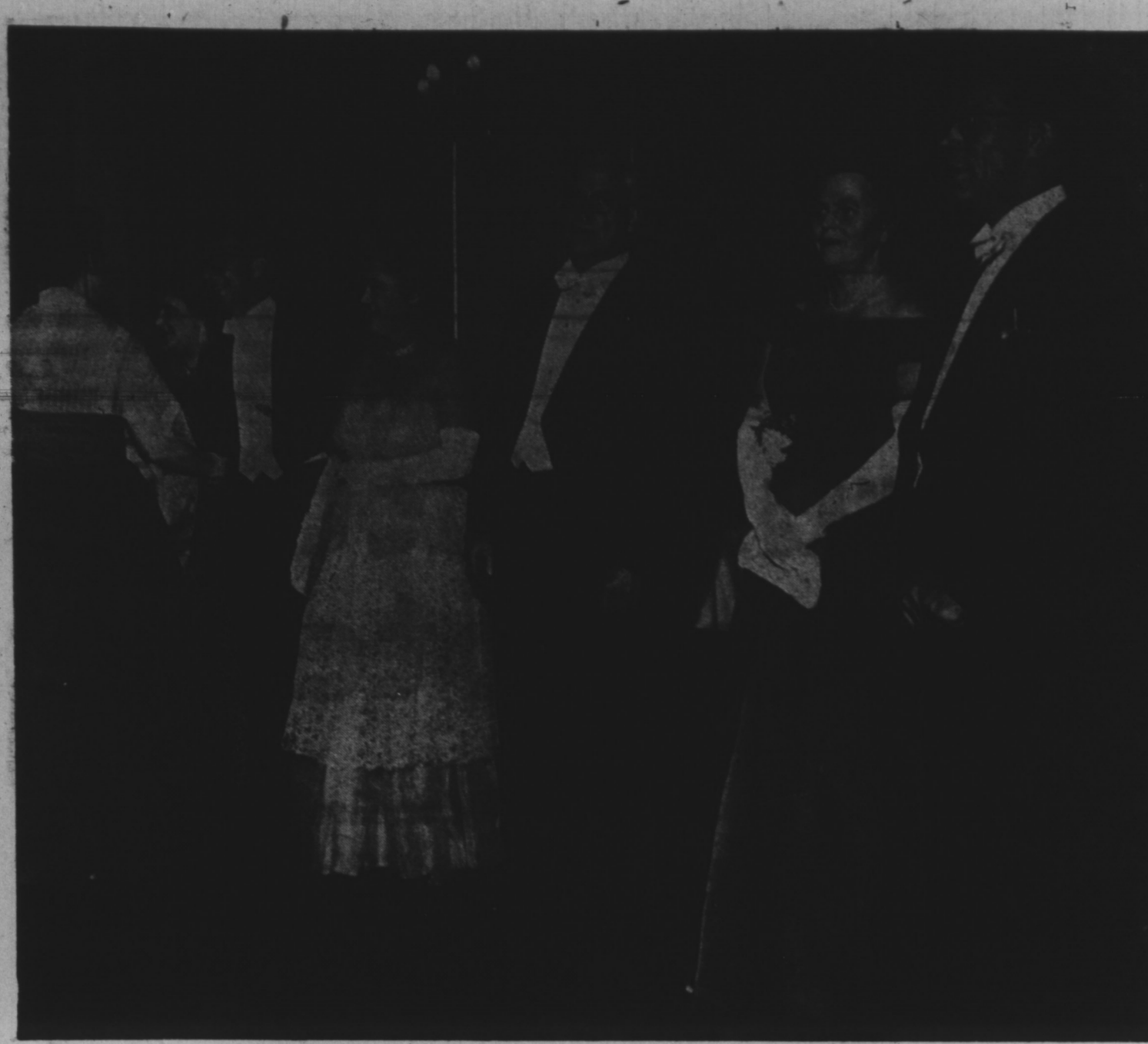
The first city charter granted in Ontario was given to Toronto, the provincial capital, in 1834.
