TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER. DOMINION PARLIAMENT. The Sugar Question Discussed. WILL NOT SELL THE I. C. R. OTTAWA, Aug. 1. In the House yesterday Deputy Governor General Strong assented to a number of bills. The House in committee of ways and means, discussed the sugar question. In the Senate Mr. Abbott said the Government did not intend to sell the Intercolonial, and one of the first duties of the Government after prorogation would be to consider the whole question of the management of the Government Railways. The only clause of general public importance in the Franchise Amendment Act, which was assented to yesterday, is that extending the date for receiving applications to the 15th August.

THE TARTE-McGREGGEEVY CASE

MR. PERLEY FAINTS AGAIN. Captain Larkins on the Stand. OTTAWA, Aug. 1. In the Tarte-McGreevy inquest yesterday Mr. Perley was under examination when he fainted, and it was a long while before he recovered consciousness. He is dying of heart disease. Captain Larkins was examined at length as to the dealings of the firm of Larkins, Connolly & Co. He swore he never had any business dealings with Thomas McGreevy, never paid money to Thomas or Langevin, and was never told that money had been paid. Larkins also swore that he never received the letter which Robert McGreevy swore he sent him, complaining of improper payments, ever heard of Murphy's career till Murphy had been a registered member of the firm for eighteen months, and never borrowed money from Murphy. He is not the sort of a man he would borrow money from. Murphy had obtained his reluctant consent to the firm lending Robert McGreevy \$22,000, which he afterwards found was charged to the firm. He agreed to subscriptions for elections. He was not often in Quebec, and knew little of the business of the firm, as he had other contracts.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS ENQUIRY

THE CRITS DISAPPOINTED. OTTAWA, Aug. 1. In the Public Accounts Committee the Crits are disappointed, not finding some scandals they expected. They are determined to obstruct business, and during the session of three hours only four questions were asked, two of which were ruled out.

THE CROPS DAMAGED.

Men Injured and Cattle Killed. CALGARY, Aug. 1. A severe hail storm in the foot hills of the Rocky Mountains has done much damage. Many employes of the North West Cattle Company were injured, and some cattle were killed. The crops suffered severely. The weather in and about here is very cool, with frequent heavy rains.

SERIOUS RAILWAY ACCIDENT.

CLEVELAND, O., Aug. 1. There was a serious railway accident at Bellairs yesterday. Many people were severely injured. It is thought that some of the injured will not recover.
