## 19 Names Are Added To Spacemen

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) — The United States has bolstered its astronaut crop to 50 by naming 19 new spacemen, thus supplying manpower for flights to the moon and beyond.

Selection came almost seven years after the U.S. selected its original seven Mercury astronauts, seven Americans to venture into space.

Faced with a rapid-fire pace of flights, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration picked the largest group of astronauts ever at one time.

Called "fifth generation" astronauts because they are the fifth group, the new team will begin training in May. It includes four civilians.

All are jet pilots. Two became the only bachelor astronauts.

SIX WOMEN FAILED

Officials picked the 19 from 351 men and women who applied. Six women tried but did not meet the minimum requirements.

Since the manned space program began, the United States already had named 36 men as astronauts. Three were killed in jet crashes, two resigned and three are not on flight status because of medical disorders.

## Breweries Employees Examined

QUEBEC (CP) — A group of employees of Dow Breweries here, said to be regular consumers of beer, have submitted to medical examinations.

John Joubert, manager of the plant, said here.

It was not known how many men took the examinations, which started Saturday. The plant employs 175 men.

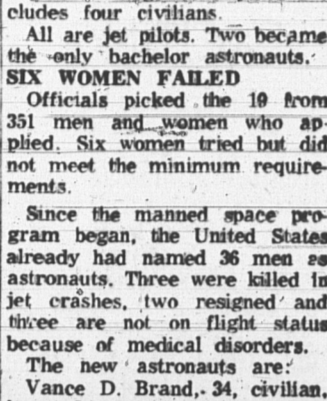
The brewery decided last week to call in all beer it had distributed in eastern Quebec and destroy it. The decision came after 16 middle-aged men had died in the area in a two-month period.

A federal-provincial investigation of the deaths has produced no evidence that the deaths were caused by beer, authorities said. However, Dow said in a statement that it was destroying the beer "to contribute further to the official investigation and in order to reassure consumers in the area served by our Quebec City plant."

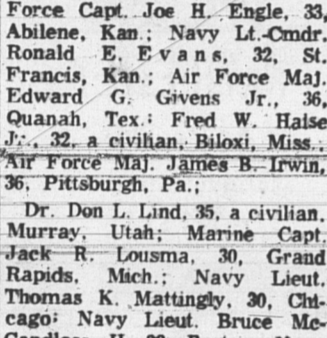
## ACT AGAINST NUISANCES

OTTAWA (CP) — Officials of the Combines Act investigation branch are still studying the recent increases in the price of bread. Prime Minister Pearson told the Commons.

Until they reported their opinions on the increases, no government action would be taken, Mr. Pearson said in replying to Opposition Leader Diefenbaker.

Mr. Diefenbaker said the increases were four cents a loaf in some areas and asked for a report promised a few weeks ago by Mr. Pearson.
