Magistrate's Court was held at Georgetown on Wednesday, Oct. 9th, at 1:30 p.m. with Kings County Stipendiary Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet, presiding.

A resident of Gaspereaux and a resident of Montague were each fined \$10. for causing a disturbance by fighting, contrary to a town of Montague by-law.
