### A PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY

GEORGE DUNDAS, ESQUIRE,

Lieut. Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Island Prince Edward, and the Territories thereunto belonging, Chancellor, Vic-

[L.S.] Admiral and Ordinary of the same, &c., &c., &c.

GEORGE DUNDAS, Lieut. Governor.

WHEREAS a certain Treaty was made between Her Majesty and the United States of America, on the 5th day of June, 1854, providing for Reciprocal Trade:

And whereas the United States of America have, in accordance with the terms of the said Treaty, given notice for the termination thereof. And whereas in consequence of such notice the said Treaty will expire on the Seventeenth day of March, 1866.

And whereas under the said Treaty many persons, citizens of the United States of America, have invested moneys and fitted out Ships for the purpose of carrying on the (in-shore) Fisheries within the Territory of Prince Edward Island, under the said Treaty. And whereas they may be unaware that their right to carry on such in-shore Fisheries will end on the said 17th day of March, instant.

And whereas it is desirable that due precaution be taken to prevent injury or loss to any of Her Majesty's subjects, or to the citizens of a State with which Her Majesty, the Queen of Great Britain, is happily in amity. Now, therefore, I have thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council of this Island, to issue this my Proclamation, and I do hereby caution and warn all persons, not subjects of Her Majesty, that after the 17th day of March, inst., no vessels owned and manned in the United States of America, can pursue the in-shore Fisheries without rendering themselves liable to the confiscation of their vessels, and such other penalties, pecuniary and personal, as are by law imposed.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of this Island, at Charlottetown, in the said Island, this Seventh day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.
