

Girl Is Given Even Chance Severed Arm Can Be Saved

CALGARY (CP)—Hazel Donley leaves today for her California home and the odds are even that she will have her arm saved.

The 18-year-old from Kelseyville, Calif., will spend the American Thanksgiving with her family. Then she will enter a San Francisco hospital in readiness for the next operation on the arm that was given back to her by two Calgary surgeons last July.

Hazel's arm was severed July 19 when she struck a guy wire after falling from a carnival ride at the Calgary Stampede. In the second known operation of its kind, the arm was re-joined.

Skin grafts have been necessary and the thumb was lost but circulation was restored to the arm.

Red Chinese Trade Mission Dissatisfied

OTTAWA (CP)—Two trade missions from Communist China which visited Canada during the last year have "since indicated some dissatisfaction with the results achieved to date," the trade department reported Monday.

A written statement tabled in the Commons for Barry Mather (NDP—New Westminster) said both groups had sought to promote sales of Red Chinese products in Canada.

"The Canadian government is hopeful that ways and means will be found to maintain and further developing this trade to the mutual advantage of both trading partners within the framework of Canadian International relations and essential Canadian interests," the reply said.

Mr. Mather also asked about Red China's share in Canadian textile imports. The department said total textile imports in 1961 were \$56,942,785. Of this, only \$99,487 worth came from Red China, or 2 per cent of the total.

Earl Alexander Explains Memoirs

CALGARY (CP)—Field Marshal Earl Alexander of Tunis says "little changes" made in dispatches in his wartime memoirs were carried out by him at the request of the war office and blown out of proportion in the British House of Commons when the memoirs were published.

A minor change in a sentence of a dispatch, he said, had appeared to critics to give undue credit to Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery.

He said credit for the success of the Second World War North African campaign belonged to no single person, and shared credit for it with Montgomery and his predecessor, Field Marshal Sir Claude Auchinleck.

The 70-year-old visitor arrived here with his wife Saturday for a combined business and pleasure visit, to spend some time with his son, Stuart, 27, Calgary businessman, and to confer with business associates.

House Briefs

OTTAWA (CP)—Labor Minister Starr assured Paul Martin (L—Essex East) that translators are "working feverishly" on a translation of the report of the Gill commission into the Unemployment Insurance Fund.

It cost an average of \$2,563.72 to maintain a prisoner in a federal penitentiary in the 1961-62 fiscal year, Thomas M. Bell, parliamentary secretary to Justice Minister Fleming, advised Jack Bonborough (L—Norfolk).

A petition from the town of Carbonara, Nfld., requesting construction of a fishermen landing and slipway is being studied by the government, Works Minister Fulton said in a written reply to James R. Tucker (L—Trinity-Conception).

Transport Minister Balcer told S. H. Ridout (L—Westmorland) that he would be "very surprised" if there was any truth to a report that the Canadian National Railways had plans to close its station at Moncton.

The defence department has decided to move the RCAF Golden Hawks aerial acrobatic team from their base at Chatham, N.B., to another air force station because facilities at Chatham are insufficient for all air defence activities as well as the Golden Hawks, G. Roy McWilliam (L—Northumberland-Miramichi) was informed. Location of the Golden Hawks' new base was not given.

Labrador Vote Is Deferred

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—Newfoundland's chief electoral officer Nehemiah Shier announced Saturday the election in Labrador North had been deferred because of bad weather.

Mr. Shier said bad weather in the area for the last four or five days made it impossible to get ballot boxes and election materials to the polls. He said there was no indication when the election would be held. Labrador North was one of the 42 seats at stake Monday in the provincial election.

In Calgary during the week-end, San Francisco specialist Dr. Walter Treanor said chances are so-so.

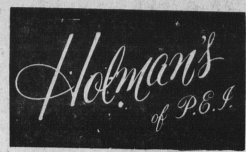
