### Medical Insurance Program Suggested By Que. Doctors

MONTREAL (CP) — Recommendations to the Quebec government by the Quebec College of Physicians and surgeons for a medical insurance plan:

1. Participation by all residents of Quebec regardless of financial ability, age or state of health.
2. All medical services to apply, including diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation and prevention.
3. Optional participation by doctors.
4. Uniformity of contributions by participants. Figures applying in Alberta were set forth as a basis for discussion.
5. The government would pay all or part of costs when a participant is incapable of doing so.
6. Services to be paid for only when authorized by doctors.
7. No prohibitive fees for patients entirely subsidized by the government.
8. Free choice of doctors by patients, and patients by doctors.
9. Remuneration of doctors

to be in accordance with services given and not based on financial ability of the participant.

10. Doctors to have the right to choose the means of remuneration they prefer.
11. Doctors to have the right to determine care, treatment and medicines for patients.
12. A system to be established for provision of funds for medical and other services.
13. Fees to be paid directly to doctors.
14. Representatives of the medical profession to be present when stages of the plan are introduced.
15. Representation of the medical profession in dealing with the mechanics of administration and legal phases of the system.

## DAILY MARKETS

### NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market put on a fairly steady performance Monday as trading slackened because of semi-holiday conditions.

The Columbus Day observance was accompanied by the closing of many banks, insurance companies and commodity markets, taking away some of the steam from Wall Street.

Nevertheless, prices were generally firm. Gainers outnumbered losers slightly on the New York Stock Exchange and some market indicators inched to records.

Concern was expressed the strike against General Motors will have a lingering effect on the sales of 1965 auto models. At the same time, strong steel demand was said to be likely to ease if the General Motors walkout doesn't end soon.

General Motors stock ended with a gain of 1/4 at 102 1/2 after recovering from a small early loss. Fractional gains were made by Ford, American Motors and Studebaker, the latter rising 3/4 to 7 on 124,500 shares, making it the most active stock. Chrysler lost 1/2.

Losses of some component key stocks tipped the Dow Jones Industrial average to a moderate loss of 31 at 87.57. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 1 to a high of 329.3.

Texas Gulf Sulphur lost 1/4. Although U.S. Steel rose 1/2, most leading steels were lower.

### 1,000 Military Personnel Due For Retirement

OTTAWA (CP) — Associate Defence Minister Carlin said in the Commons that "perhaps 1,000" military personnel at National Defence Headquarters will be retired compulsorily.

Defence minister Hellyer an-

ounced earlier this week that up to 122 brigadiers, colonels, lieutenant-colonels and majors or their equivalents in the navy and RCAF will be retired compulsorily between Nov. 1 and next summer.

Mr. Carlin was replying to Gordon Churchill, former Conservative defence minister, who asked whether keeping officers in suspense concerning which ones would be retired was a satisfactory method of dealing with the situation.

Mr. Churchill also said the officers being retired should be given six months' notice instead of three months' notice.

Mr. Carlin said it has been found that three months' notice is sufficient.

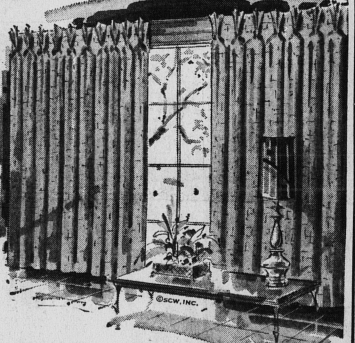
