THE CENTURY FUND

Great Success of the Methodists in England.

LONDON, March 9.—The effort on the part of the Wesleyan Methodists of England to raise one million guineas (\$5,000,000) as a Twentieth Century Fund is meeting with extraordinary success, and there is good reason to believe that the fund will be completed long before the century begins. It is only three months since subscriptions were first collected, and, notwithstanding that the roll will remain open until January 1, 1901, more than \$2,500,000 has been guaranteed and the increase. Rev. Albert Clayton, secretary of the fund, has given figures which show how remarkable has been the response to the appeal.

The number of Wesleyan Methodist districts in the United Kingdom is thirty-four, sub-divided in 814 circuits. Of the districts twenty-five have, so far, been visited by the officers of the fund, and 524 out of the 814 circuits have sent in their promises of contributions, amounting to \$2,540,300. From the remaining 129 circuits in the division which have been visited, but which have not yet promised, Mr. Clayton thinks that at least \$500,000 may be expected, and then their remains 161 circuits in districts which have not yet been visited and on the same basis of reckoning they should yield more than another \$500,000. That would run the fund up to over \$3,500,000 on the first appeal.

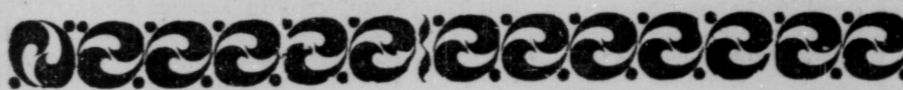

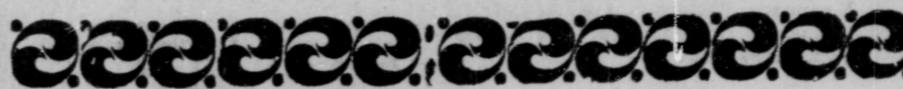
