open in Geneva in May, Erroll said Britain intends to play its full part in expanding world trade and engaging in reduction of tariffs under the U.R. Trade Expansion Act. This authorizes President Kennedy to reduce Common Market membership from a five-year period.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

For example, look at this hand played in a team match. At the first table, nothing much happened. South got to four spades on the bidding shown and West led a diamond. East took the king and continued with the ace. Declarer ruffed, led a trump, and eventually lost club to make exactly four spades.
At the second table, the same contract was reached on similar bidding, but here the defense went down one.
West led a four of diamonds, and East won with the king. But the East at the table did not continue the suit. He realized from the bidding and the opening lead that his hand had almost surely started with a singleton diamond.
That being a future to another diamond lead, he shifted to the ace of clubs at the two he hoped to find West with the king of clubs, in which case he planned to lead another club and obtain a ruff to defeat the contract.
West did not have the king and might have played the defence on the ace to deny it, but he did have the ace of spades which he passed up, not realizing that he realized that East was trying to get a club ruff. He played the nine on the ace, asking for another club lead.
East happily obliged, and though he was temporarily disappointed when declarer showed up with the king, this did not prevent him from getting a ruff club ruff a short time later when declarer led a 10 of spades. West took the ace and returned a club and South went down one as a result of the fine defense.
