

New Seed Potato Rules Summarized

Some changes in regulations for the planting of seed potatoes were announced recently in the Legislature. The following is a summary of these regulations as they apply to the 1966 crop year.

Any potato producer who had positive or contact ring rot in his potatoes in 1965 should have all potatoes of his farm by this date and must have the warehouse and/or cellar cleaned up and ready for disinfection by April 15.

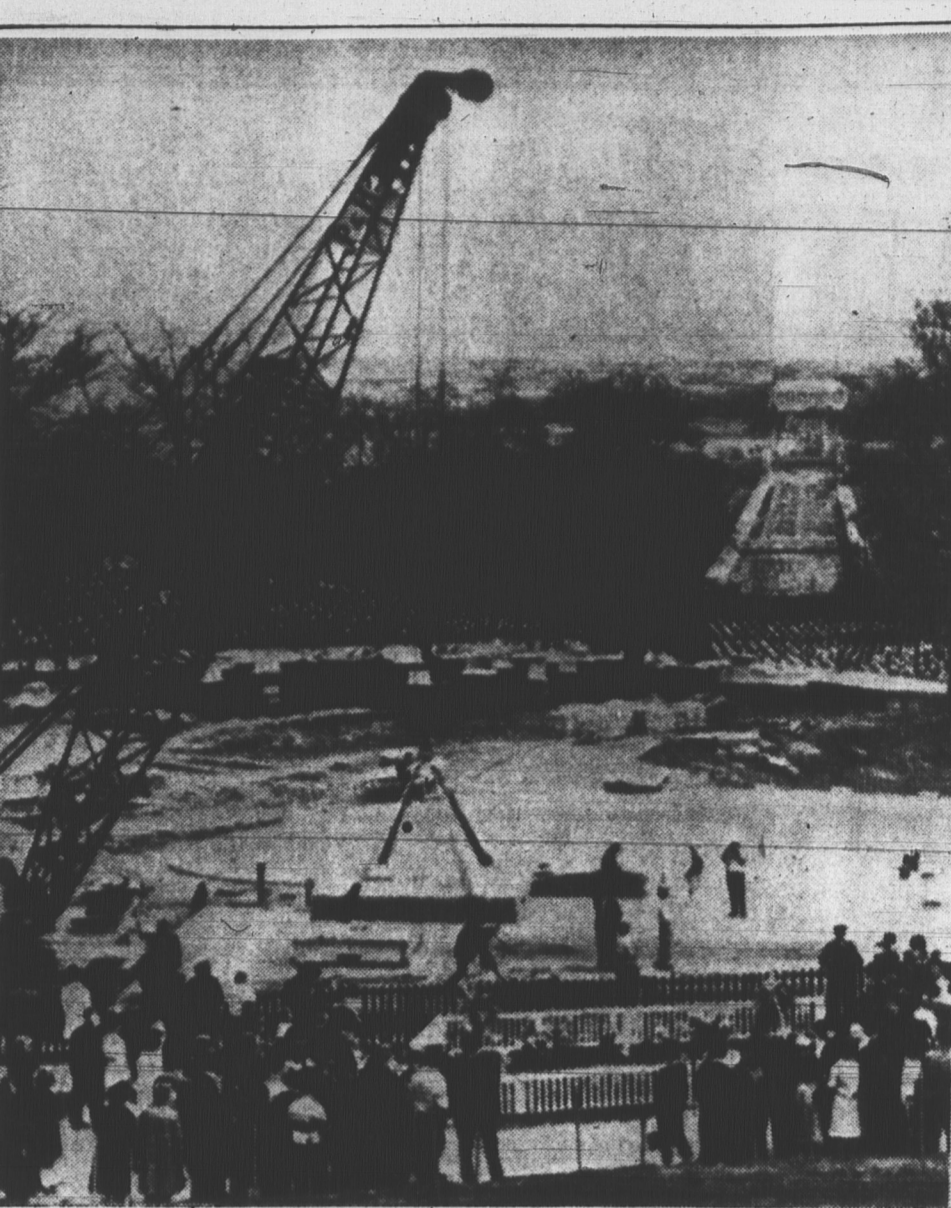
Plant certified or Foundation Seed potatoes. Any fields that grew potatoes last year which developed positive or contact cases of ring rot must not be planted in potatoes this current crop year.

either disease problems must be cleaned up, or the industry will suffer seriously. If we choose to clean it up, then it is necessary for each person to do his part to eradicate ring rot.

For the farmer who had a positive or contact potato ring rot crop last year, it means cleaning up and thoroughly disinfecting his buildings before seed is brought onto the farm.

For further information, the local seed inspector should be contacted. RING ROT Most potato growers by this time should be aware of the serious disease problem that threatens the seed potato industry in this province.
