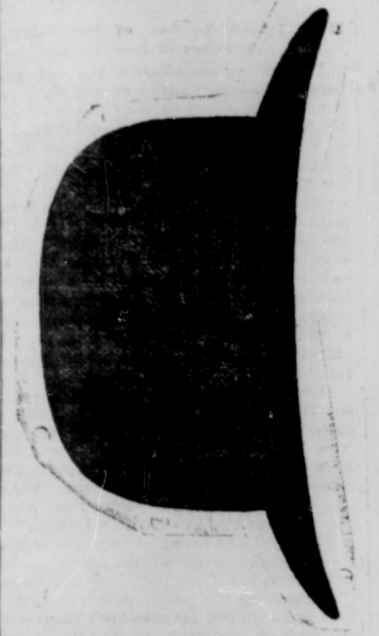

PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.
Foster's Effective Speech.
 Consternation in the Civil Service.

OTTAWA, March 29.
 It is generally conceded that Hon. Mr. Foster's speech on Friday evening was the most effective one—so effective, indeed, that the Government, which was anxious to close the debate on the address this evening, could not allow Foster's points to pass unanswered. Accordingly it was decided that Sir Richard Cartwright should reply. This accounts for his moving the adjournment of the debate. Just how long the debate will continue it is not now possible to say.
 In connection with the Diamond Jubilee, honors an interesting rumor is in circulation here, to the effect that Sir Charles Fugate will be raised to the peerage for his services in promoting the unity of the Empire.
 From present appearances the civil service of Canada has fallen on evil days. It is said that the bill to amend the Civil Service Act will make sweeping changes, even to the extent that no appointments hereafter will be of a permanent nature.
