

# British Gov't Lops Away Subsidy On Bread Today

LONDON (CP) — Britain lops away the bread subsidy this week-end, setting the stage for some crusty competition between the giants of the baking business and the small corner-store bakeries.

Right away, the so-called national loaf—1½ pounds unwrapped and unsliced—will cost more, depending where the consumer buys it.

In port areas, such as London, Liverpool, Bristol or Hull, the big bakeries will charge 10d a loaf. Inland, where flour costs include transport charges, the mass-produced, machine-made loaf will be half-penny more.

At the small corner bakery, the price will be about 11d. The small bakers say oven-cooked bread costs more to produce than the plant loaf, but feel that the public will be glad to pay more to get loaves of distinctive shapes and flavor.

When the government provided an annual £40,000,000 subsidy as an ingredient in the price structure, bakers charged the same price everywhere—8½d.

With the subsidy ending on bread, as it has already done on sugar, butter, cheese, bacon, potatoes, margarine and eggs, Britons are seeing almost the last of war-imposed price controls. Only

milk remains subsidized.

The small bakers recommended the 11d price on the ground their bread would be worth the extra penny. The Economist, a weekly London journal, says they should have extolled the virtues of their crusty loaves five months ago, telling "how they strengthen the teeth and curl the hair."

Instead they tried the self-pity approach, with tales of family bakers going out of business.

The Manchester Guardian, on the other hand, expects many families—after "eating dust and ashes, wrapped in lint" for 15 years—to be willing to pay a penny more for a craftsman's loaf.
