MONTREAL (CP) — Stocks continued Friday's rally over a broad front Monday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges.
Banks turned to lower levels, but all other sections moved fractionally higher in light trading.
Although advances only edged declines 85 to 83, the composite index showed a rise of 0.64 to 159.46.
Industrial volume was 104,000 shares and mines and oils 887,700.
Utilities led the upward trend as the section advanced 1.61 at 148.81. Calgary Power jumped one point to 26 1/2 and CPR 1 1/2 points to 62. B.C. Telephone rose 1/4 to 74 1/4.
The industrial index climbed 1.02 at 167.22. Moore-Copeland jumped one point to 83 and Du Pont 3/4 to 44.
RALLIED AT CLOSE
Papers were off in early dealings but rallied towards the close, climbing 0.21 at 122.08 at the final bell. Consolidated and Great Lakes each climbed 1/4. Banks dropped 0.59 at 125.18. Montreal and Imperial Commerce each fell 1/4.
Senior metals moved higher. In the base section Hudson Bay Mining rose 1/2 and International Nickel 1/4. Among primary issues Aluminum climbed 1/4.
Senior oils were up with Imperial adding 1/4 to 53 1/2. Speculative mines and oils were mixed. Phoenix Canadian jumped 30 cents to \$4.35. Peace River dropped 35 cents to \$8.75.
