### Local and Other Items.

**THE PEACE CONFERENCE**—The peace conference came to a close on Saturday.

**SMALLPOX**—Smallpox has broken out in a mild form in Toronto. The fourth case was reported last Saturday.

**THE CROPS IN NOVA SCOTIA**—The Nova Scotia crop report for the province recently issued by the Secretary of Agriculture shows that hay as well as other crops will be fully up to if not above the average. The potato crop and all root crops promise an abundant yield, being 5 to 10 per cent above the average. So with oats and other grain crops. Insect pests have not given much annoyance this season. The potato beetle has ceased to be a scourge of late years.

**PARTICULAR**—Queen Wilhelmina, who, not long ago objected to the portrait of herself appearing on the postage stamps of the kingdom because the hair only fell to her neck, has now requested the withdrawal of the present coinage on which her effigy is that of a child and the substitution of her present likeness. For this change she chooses the epoch of the peace conference as the most appropriate. Accordingly the well known Dutch artist, Pander, has been commissioned to modify a bust of Her Majesty for reproduction.

**DARKEST RUSSIA**—Which comes to the Opera House next Tuesday evening is a play full of strongly drawn dramatic scenes and situation and it will be played with special scenery and stage effects. While the play is a drama in the full sense of the word, the comedy element with which the story is permeated is bright, amusing, clean and full of laugh-producing complications. The company is said to be one of unusual excellence and fully competent to bring out all of the beauty of this long lived and popular play which is now in its seventh consecutive season.

**PATENT REPORTS**—From the recent report of the United States Commissioner of patents, it appears there were received in the last fiscal year 35,352 applications for mechanical patents, 2,292 applications for designs, 91 applications for reissues, 1,610 caveats, 1,861 applications for trade marks, 612 applications for labels, and 112 applications for prints. There were 22,570 patents granted, including reissues and designs; 1,406 trade marks, 372 labels and 78 prints were registered. The number of patents that expired was 16,670. The number of allowed applications which were by operation of law forfeited for non-payment of the final fee was 4,021. The total receipts of the office were \$1,209,534.88, the total expenditures were \$1,148,663.48, and the surplus of receipts over expenditures, being the amount turned into the treasury, was \$60,871.40. On the 27th of June, 1899, every examiner had his new work within one month of date of filing and his amended work within fifteen days of date. This is the first time since December, 1899, when the present form of weekly reports was adopted, that such a report has or could have been made. This information is received through Messrs. Marion & Marion, patent solicitors, Montreal.

The ceremony was performed by the Rev. P. J. Hogan. The bride, who was gracefully attired in a blue silk costume with white trimmings and hat to match, was attended by her sister, Miss Veronica McGillveray, while Mr. Angus S. McAulay very ably supported the groom. After the marriage ceremony was performed the bridal party drove to the seashore, where a few happy hours were spent, after which they returned to the residence of the bride's brother, Mr. J. J. McGillveray, where a grand reception was given. After spending a few hours most pleasantly and having partaken of the many luxuries provided for such an occasion, the happy couple, accompanied by a number of their friends, drove to their future home in Johnson's River. The numerous elegant and costly wedding gifts gave expression of the popularity of both bride and groom, and of the high esteem in which they are held by their many friends.
