MOB LAW IN THE STATES.—The New York Journal says: More men are put to death by mobs in the United States every year than die on the scaffold. The percentage of legal executions to killings for the past ten years has been only 2.20. Not all these killings numbering over 48,000, were deliberate murders, of course, but the grotesque disproportion between the homicides and hangings gives some measure of the responsibility of the administrators of the law for the popularity of lynching. Where juries and courts do their duty most swiftly and sternly the lyncher is rarest. That fact is eloquent.

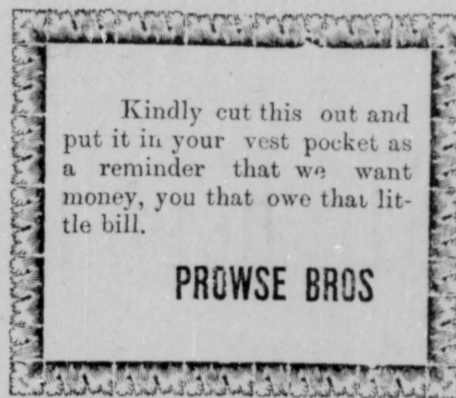
