Boxer's Condition Still Unchanged

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The condition of stricken Argentine heavyweight Alejandro Lavornate remained unchanged Wednesday. He has been unconscious since Dec. 21, when he was knocked out by unheralded Johnny Riggin at the Sports Arena. Although the six-foot-four boxer has remained in a coma since being carried out of the

ring on a stretcher, doctors say he apparently is able to hear some whispered instructions to move his arms and legs. He has undergone several operations to remove blood clots and reduce pressure on his brain. Neurosurgeons say they are unable to determine the full extent of brain damage until Lavornate regains consciousness. Before his knockout at the hands of Riggin, Lavornate suffered consecutive knockout defeats by Archie Moore and Cassius Clay earlier this year.

Big Steeler Back Trying To Overtake Jim Taylor

NEW YORK (AP) — Time is running out for John Henry Johnson in his bid to overtake Green Bay's Jim Taylor for the National Football League's individual rushing honors, but the big Pittsburgh fullback has not given up trying.

Johnson, supposed to play second fiddle to rookie Bob Ferguson at the start of the season, gained 98 yards against St. Louis last Sunday to gain some ground but Taylor still leads with two weeks to go, 1,239 yards to Johnson's 1,016.

Although held to only 61 yards, Taylor rushed over two touchdowns against Los Angeles and took over the scoring lead with 102 points, based on
