Columnists Speculating On Durrelle-Archie Moore Match

DETROIT (CP)— Before the bell sounded for the first round of the Yvon Durrelle-Willi Besmanoff fight here Wednesday night, Detroit sport columnists were speculating on the possibilities of a Durrelle-Archie Moore match.

Peter Waldmeir in the Detroit News said he feels people read "more into it (Moore's statement) than Moore actually said."

He says Moore-Durrelle match "would mean nothing in the United States" while "after his shabby showing against James Parker in Toronto a year ago, a Moore-Durrelle fight would be a good drawing card in Detroit."

Waldmeir says the "ideal opponent" for Durrelle would be Chuck Spieser of Detroit who lost to Anthony here last spring. He says the fight would bring Durrelle more money than he would get anywhere on the continent and would give good promotion to Durrelle-Moore match if Durrelle won.

NEW YORK (AP)—Bill King, manager of Louisville's new Kentucky State Fairgrounds Coliseum put in a bid Wednesday to stage Archie Moore's next title defence in the 22,500 seat arena.

Moore is expected to defend his light heavyweight crown against Yvon Durrelle, British Empire light heavyweight champion from Baie St. Anne, N.B. if Durrelle beats Willi Besmanoff.

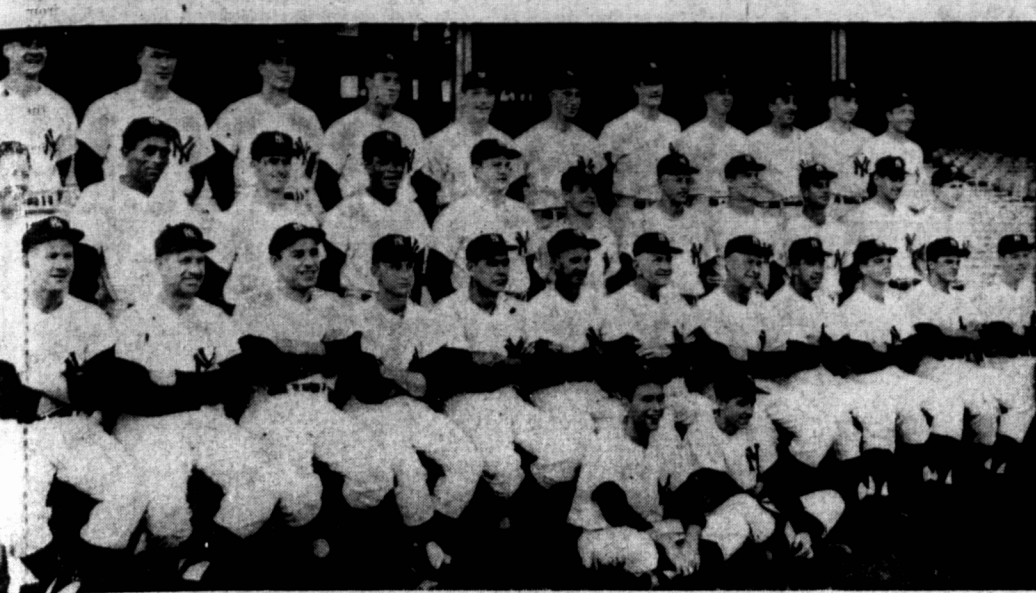

Robinson Is Undecided

NEW YORK (KAP)—Ray Robinson, Detroit middleweight champion, broke his post-fight silence Wednesday long enough to say he still is undecided whether or not he wants to fight again.

Reached by telephone, Robinson protested that it was unfair to try and pin him down about his plans at this time because he needs a few days to rest and relax before making up his mind.

Robinson said he has a contract for a return bout against his conqueror, Carmen Basilio, and if he decides to exercise it, the fight probably will take place in February. Basilio has said it is up to Robinson to say whether they'll meet again.

Robinson said he will appear at a New York state athletic commission hearing Tuesday to tell about reported bribe offers.

Insisting that he was just reminiscing about old times when he mentioned such offers, Robinson said: "This is a silly thing bringing up an old something."

Covington Now Big Hitter With Milwaukee Braves

MILWAUKEE (AP)—Wes Covington, who got a second chance in the big time when the Braves traded Bobby Thomson, looked at his .292 batting average Wednesday and recalled a casual conversation that helped him become a dangerous hitter.

One day, shortly after Covington's recall from the Wichita farm club, Red Schoendienst and Paul Waner, the Braves' batting coach, were talking about the ineffectiveness of wrist action to hitters. As the two talked, Schoendienst demonstrated the points by gripping a bat.

Covington said "I just happened to overhear them. . . I realized that with my grip, my wrists were locked. I wasn't getting that little roll of the wrists that gives the bat that final flick and adds the power."

Afterwards Schoendienst spent more time with Covington, one of the most powerful hitters in the game, and Wes' batting average started to climb. The big left fielder was hitting .125 when he rejoined the Braves before Wednesday's game with St. Louis, he was hitting .292.

In less than three months Covington has become one of the most feared hitters in the lineup of the newly crowned National League champions.

Covington pearly went to New York Giants in the 3 to 1 trade for Red Schoendienst June 15.

Bobby Thomson went instead because, it's reported, Ted McGrew, Braves' scout, said Covington "can become one of the best hitters in baseball."

Braves To Split Series Spoils Into 33 Shares

MILWAUKEE (AP)—The Milwaukee Braves voted to split their world series spoils into 33 full shares at a meeting Wednesday.

The 19 players on the Milwaukee roster from start to finish, who did the voting, agreed to include the bat boys and clubhouse attendants in the series swag.

In all, 40 players will share, ranging from a quarter to a full share.

Three players who joined the club in June were voted full shares, including one identified simply as The Roadhead. That, of course, would be Red Schoendienst, the player generally credited with being mostly responsible for the team's success.

The others were bonus players John Demerit and Bob Taylor.

The all time record money series was played in 1954 between the New York Giants and the Cleveland Indians. Each winning Giant earned \$11,147.90 and each losing Indian \$6,712.50.

Bruton Can't Play In Series

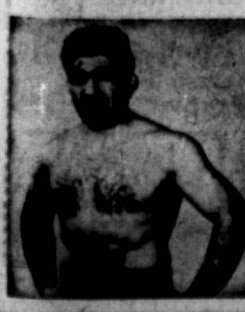
