Contract Bridge

PROCRASTINATION

It is human nature to procrastinate—to wait and see whether something worth while won't turn up. Applied to bridge hands, however, this policy is at best a little dubious! Here's a typical example:

West dealer.
North-South vulnerable.

♠ A 4 3 2
♥ 6 5 2
♦ 5 3
♣ 8 7 4 2

♠ Q J 8 6
♥ A 9 4
♦ 7 2

The bidding:

South's hand was at once too good and not quite good enough for his five-diamond opening. Even with all of his winners, he could not be sure of taking 11 tricks; and he might be shutting out an easy three no trump, or if North had a heart suit, a four-heart contract. Also, there was the chance that by preempting so high, a slam might be missed.

All this, however, is theoretical; actually, South's bid should have worked out well this time. If he had started with one diamond (he wasn't quite strong enough for two diamonds), he might have played it there!

West opened the spade queen. Dummy's ace was put up, and after considering the advantage of a heart lead from dummy, South decided instead to run six diamond tricks in the hope that the opponents would discard a few hearts.

East, particularly, did have trouble in selecting his discards, but when he actually let go two spades, one club and only one heart, South's chances vanished. When he led the heart king, West won and returned a spade, and eventually, South had to concede another heart trick and a club.

Declarer was wrong to depend on a defensive error. With only one possible entry in dummy, and that one removed at the first trick, the only reasonable play was to lead a heart toward the closed hand and to finesse the ten-spot. It is true that this might have lost—that West might have had the heart jack—but no other line of play had even a fair chance to succeed.
