

Durelle Forced To Weigh Twice

MONTREAL (CP)—Surrounded by something of comedy and excited, serious talking, the weighing proceedings Wednesday for the Yvon Durelle-Germinal Ballarin fight wound up with Durelle being weighed twice.

He was a pound heavier the second time. A steak dinner made the difference. The steak could cause some form of punishment. At the official noon weigh-in, the Basle Ste. Anne, N.B., fisherman weighed 173½. Ballarin weighed 171½ for Wednesday night's 10-round light-heavyweight bout.

When Durelle's weight was announced there was suddenly a flap among members of the Montreal Athletic Commission. The commission said Durelle's contract called for a limit of 175 pounds, but there was no forfeiture clause. The bout is a non-title affair.

GIVEN ANOTHER CHANCE
The Ballarin entourage, headed by manager Jean Bretonnel, was also excited because it was felt the few extra pounds would leave Durelle stronger than he would be at stipulated 175.

The commission hurriedly went into session. Durelle was called into the closed meeting for a few minutes. Then he disappeared. The commissioners debated some more. Then they decided to request Durelle to return at 2:30 p.m. If he could make 176—allowing him an extra pound over the contract stipulation—okay. If he couldn't or if he failed to show up he would be subject to sanctions.

Durelle's manager, Chris Shanban, didn't like this arrangement particularly. He said Durelle had "gone out to eat" but undertook to find him. Fifteen minutes later he telephoned to say he had Durelle in tow and was heading back for the commission offices.

FIGHT GOES ON
Agal Durelle shed every stick of clothing. He stepped on the scales and the pointer stopped at 179½.

"Sure, I had a big meal, steak and all," said Durelle with a grin to The Canadian Press.

Vice-chairman Eddie Asselin, in charge of the commission meeting, said there would be no interference with the fight as scheduled. He said the commission will meet later, perhaps several days after the bout, and decide what, if any, punishment should be imposed. It could be suspension of short or long duration.

DURELLE UNPERTURBED
The official weight is the noon figure, 178½. After that weigh-in Durelle indicated he didn't give a hoot.

"If this was a championship bout I'd weigh 174 or 174½," he said. "But why should I weaken myself? Five weeks ago I weighed 201."

One time I was fighting a non-title match in Detroit. I weighed about three-quarters of a pound over what was supposed to be the limit. There was some argument about it.

"I said I had my plane ticket and was ready to leave for home if the three-quarters of a pound made that much difference."

Bald Eagle finished 1½ lengths in front of Carbon Copy in the mile and 560 yards race.

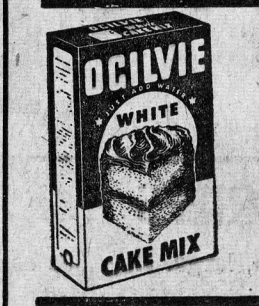

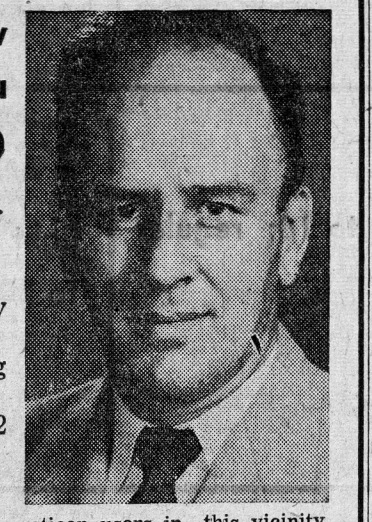
