Student Takes Case To Court BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) - Catherine Lucy, the University of Alabama's first Negro student, asked a federal judge Thursday to allow her to resume her studies at the school.

Miss Lucy, 25-year-old Birmingham secretary, was excluded from the school by the university board of trustees after rioting Monday. The school contends the board action was a safety measure.

In a companion petition, Miss Lucy asked the court to order dean J. W. Campbell to assign her to a dormitory room and to allow her to return to university during the term. She was not given formal notice when she was first admitted, which asks \$1,000 damages, was \$100 a month.

Legion To Meet

OTTAWA (CP) - The 16th Dominion convention of the Canadian Legion will open at Vancouver June 10, it was announced Thursday.

Grain Loan Legislation Over Hurdle

OTTAWA (CP) - Government legislation - strongly criticized by opposition parties - to ratify treasury guarantees of bank loans on farm-stored prairie grain passed its first Commons hurdle Thursday.

The House voted 130 to 18 to adopt a preliminary resolution and the bill then was introduced.

The vote, with only CCF members registering opposition, came after 3 1/2 days of sometimes bitter debate.

Opposition leader Drew, speaking briefly before the vote, said the legislation will not meet the urgent financial situation of prairie farmers. But Progressive Conservatives would vote for it because it "does at least offer some assistance."

Victor Queh, Social Credit spokesman, said his party takes a similar position.

All three opposition groups argued for cash advances from the Canadian wheat board to help cash-short farmers.

The bill would require government action by Nov. 15 to guarantee bank loans on farm-stored grain to a maximum \$1,500 at five-per-cent interest.

Denies Obstruction

The closing stage of the debate brought a denial by CCF leader Caldwell of a charge by Trade Minister Howe that his party is obstructing the legislation.

Another CCF member indicated the group will, however, put up a stiff fight before the bill passes.

Allister Stewart (CCF - Winnipeg North) said: "We are going to battle it until we are satisfied we cannot get any more out of the government. Then and only then will we let it go through."

Both Mr. Caldwell and Mr. Stewart referred to a statement by Mr. Howe Wednesday charging the opposition with obstructing the bill.

The opposition criticism continued he would not proceed with the legislation until the closing part of the session.

Agree On Loan For Dam Project

LONDON (Reuters) - The International Bank will loan Egypt \$200,000,000 for development and construction of the Nile dam project at Aswan, Cairo radio said Thursday night.

Eugene Black, president of the World Bank, is at present in Cairo and it was announced Wednesday night he had reached agreement with the Egyptian government on World Bank aid for the \$1,300,000,000 project.

Sees Outside Countries In Commonwealth

TORONTO (CP) - John Diefenbaker predicted Thursday that the Commonwealth some day will include European and Scandinavian countries, including France and Germany.

Addressing the Empire Club here the foreign affairs spokesman for the Progressive Conservative party cautioned that stagnation could mean disintegration of the Commonwealth.

But he foresaw the reverse. At the moment a new nation was being born within the Commonwealth at a conference among the various West Indies colonies.

"I believe that the growing and expanding process of the Commonwealth will continue and that in time it will come to include nations like Belgium, Holland, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Greece and Germany, as well as France which in the darkest days of war was invited by Churchill to become a part of this great family of nations."

Mr. Diefenbaker admitted such an expanded Commonwealth would be only a dream. But in the meantime, NATO countries should join in multi-lateral trade and remove many of their existing tariffs, which were unjust and unrealistic, to survive the economic challenge of Russia.

Voodoo Doctor Facing Charge

MONTREAL (CP) - A 28-year-old self-styled "voodoo doctor," said by police to have converted his mystical powers into a \$10,000-a-year extortion racket, has been charged here with extortion by mail.

Det. Capt. Felix Prisky, head of the fraud squad, said the suspect, who identified himself as M. P. Turban, fortune teller, was arrested Wednesday after being under surveillance about a week.

Capt. Prisky said the man, employed two simple gimmicks preyed on "gullible souls throughout the country" for about a year.

The detective said that the suspect would publish advertisements of his "magnetic power" which brought "good luck" for \$10 a month and "mummy names" for \$15 a month.
