Br. Newspaper Casualties Cause Concern And Regret

By KEN METHERAL Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON (CP)—The demise of three daily newspapers in the United Kingdom in as many months has sent an icy shiver along London's Fleet Street. The Times says such casualties mark "a dangerous social trend."

In mid-January, the Glasgow Evening News announced it was ceasing publication after almost 90 years. Two other dailies, the Birmingham Gazette and the Yorkshire Observer, published their last editions in November. The Gazette, founded more than 200 years ago, was merged with the Birmingham Post. The Observer, founded in 1824, closed out the paper had been "running at a very substantial loss and losing money steadily for more than five years."
