MIDWAY PEOPLE PREPARE FOR WEEK

Victory rated boost for Bar.

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — A lawyer-educationalist who spent 13 years as president of Brigham Young University won the Republican nomination today for U.S. senator from Utah.

Final count from the state's 1,222 voting districts showed a record primary turnout, as Dr. Ernest L. Wilkinson polled 61-113 and his opponent, Representative Sherman P. Lloyd 59,454.

Republicans said Wilkinson's victory assured well for Republican presidential nominee Barry Goldwater.

One member of Lloyd's campaign staff hinted the civil rights issue led to his candidate's defeat. Lloyd voted for the new civil rights law, Wilkinson, attacking the vote, said he thought it "would under in a police state if not handled with care and restraint."

Talks planned for London

SALISBURY (Reuters) — Southern Rhodesia's Prime Minister Ian Smith announced Tuesday he will fly to London early next month for talks with British Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home in what observers regard as a final effort to obtain independence for Southern Rhodesia.

If Britain's terms are regarded as still too high, it is believed Smith—leader of a white minority government—will return assured of the support of the bulk of the white electorate for a unilateral declaration of independence.

The question of independence for Southern Rhodesia, a self-governing colony, dominated discussions at the Commonwealth prime minister's conference in London in early July.

Thomson flies to meet Nikita

MOSCOW (Reuters) — Lord Thomson, Canadian-born newspaper magnate, left here by air today for Tselinograd, in the virgin lands area of Kazakhstan, where he will meet Soviet Premier Khrushchev.

Thomson arrived here Monday on a three-week fact-finding tour of the Soviet Union.

It was not known when he would see the Soviet leader. Thomson first met Khrushchev on a visit to Moscow in February, 1963.
