

## Ordination Of Two Anglican Priests Slated For Port Hill

Rev. R. H. Waterman, D.D., former bishop of Nova Scotia, will ordain two Anglican priests and administer confirmation at four rural island churches when he departs for the Rt. Rev. W. W. Davis, D.D., Bishop of Nova Scotia, in conducting a visitation of Anglican rural parishes on P.E.I. from Sunday, Oct. 20 to Friday, Oct. 25.

The ordination of Deaneys Deaneys, Rev. Edward Flinders and Rev. Delmont Yeo to the priesthood will take place Oct. 24 at 10.30 a.m. at St. James' Church, Port Hill. Mr. Yeo will be inducted as rector of the parish of Port Hill the same evening.

Confirmations will also be administered at St. John's Church, Cranport; St. Mark's, Kensington; St. John's, St. Eleanor's, and St. Peter's, Alberton. Bishops Waterman will also visit churches at Cherry Valley and Milton.

## Mother House Move Is Planned For Jan. 15

With their new Mother House, construction on the site of the old Mother House, St. Edward Road, the Sisters of St. Martha will move into the \$1,600,000 residence next Jan. 15.

The new building replaces the existing Mother House on the same property which was purchased by the order in 1929, with the old farm house being demolished and later in 1947, a new wing added.

In August, 1962, excavation was started on a new Mother House to be situated in front of the old building. The new residence will house 120 nuns, and will be a chapel and auditorium.
