Editorial Notes.

Signs are not wanting that many influential persons in the United States are changing their views as to Reciprocity of trade with Canada.

Capt. Arthur Irving, of Cape Traverse, P. E. Island, was a few days ago examined before the Committee on Communication with P. E. Island.

A "Rambler" at Ottawa, has discovered that the life of "a Representative of the People" is not all ease and pleasure.

This morning, the writer was in the office of an hon. Senator (who does not live in Charlottetown.)

As passed in Committee of the House of Commons, Sir S. L. Tilley's Bill to amend the Banking Act provides that the penalty upon an excess of circulation over the paid-up capital of the bank shall be \$100 if the excess is not more than \$20,000.

Sir John Macdonald has very emphatically and, we trust, finally contradicted the slanders of the Grit press concerning Governor Dewdney.

It is rumored that the royal and princely personages who attended the German Crown Prince's silver wedding celebration have resolved upon being represented at the Czar's approaching coronation by proxy.

In the Supreme Court at Halifax last fall a Miss Cameron, residing in a country town, sued a Mr. MacDonald for breach of promise of marriage.

Methodist Union.

The contemplated Union of the Methodist Church of Canada, the Methodist Episcopal Church, the Primitive Methodist Church, and the Bible Christian Church, is an ecclesiastical movement of great importance.

From the first it was felt to be a matter for gratitude that there were no doctrinal differences in the way of union. Whatever difficulties there were would rather relate to constitutional changes, and matters of finance than to the doctrines taught.

The Union Committee deemed it desirable to submit the basis to the different Church Courts to be voted upon as a whole, and not to allow it to be dealt with section by section.

The General Assembly. THE MODERATORSHIP. The Kingston Presbytery have unanimously nominated the Rev. Kenneth McLennan, of this city, for the position of Moderator of the General Assembly.

A good deal of time was given to the consideration of matters of finance—particularly the Supernumerary Funds. As some of the Churches had made great efforts to provide for their aged Ministers, it was of the utmost importance that no injustice should be done to them.

The name suggested by the Union Committee for the united church is the simple designation of "The Methodist Church." This will be a gain to its adherents in Newfoundland, the Bermudas, and Japan.

Difficulties there will be in equally adjusting so many vested interests. Sound judgment and great tact will be

required in re-arranging the circuits and districts in some parts of the Dominion. However, there are no difficulties that good sound sense, and Christian charity cannot overcome.

We notice with pleasure that the various Church Courts are declaring, almost unanimously, in favor of the Basis. A few, however, of the Ministers of the Methodist Church are raising technical points, and suggesting financial difficulties ahead.

If after the Union takes place, there are found to be things in the basis which are not working well, we suppose that the United Church will be found capable of adjusting itself so as to carry on its work to the best advantage.

WRESTLING.—A catch-as-catch-can wrestling match between Wm. Muldoon, of New York and John Smith of Toronto, Muldoon to throw Smith six times within an hour, took place at Albert Hall, Toronto, on the 20th.
