

Local and Other Items.

SIR JOHN A. McDONALD will be absent about six weeks.

A STORY is published by the Paris *Moniteur* that for a year past England has been helping the Sultan of Morocco for a conflict with Spain, and that English generals and engineers have been training his soldiers and fortifying Tangier.

DR. HUGH J. GLENN, or "Farmer Glenn," the candidate for Governor of California, of the new constitution party, cultivates 45,000 acres of land and has 10,000 acres in wood. He owes \$600,000 on it, but will clear half of that this year. He is a Virginian by birth, a Missourian by education, and formerly a horse dealer by occupation. He is also the democratic candidate and is opposed to the railroads.

LAST EVENING a Frenchman by the name of Maxim Petipeau fell from a raft on which he had been working into the water. He had a severe struggle to get on the raft again, after swallowing considerable water. He was kindly cared for by the people at the Point, and it was thought he had entirely recovered from the accident, but this morning he went into his fit and died very suddenly.—*Moncton Times.*

A DESPATCH from Rome of the 31st ult., says: "The decision of the German Government on the religious questions at issue with the Vatican permits all exiled clergy who ask permission to be allowed to return to Germany, the May laws to be tacitly suspended, provided the clergy obey the common law, and all fresh nominations to be submitted to the Government. The Pope is satisfied with these terms."

CHRISTINE COX was, on the 17th of July, found guilty of the murder of Mrs. Hull, late of 140 West 42nd street, New York, and sentenced by Judge Cowing to be hanged August 29th. Judge Noah Davis, however, has granted a writ of error in the case, and thereupon Judge Potter, in the Supreme Court Chambers, granted a stay of proceedings. The writ is made returnable on the first Monday of Oct., when the proceedings of the Court of General Sessions will be reviewed. This is certainly an outrage on common decency.

THE barque *Perserverance*, from Quebec for England, timber laden, put ashore water-logged, on the southern side of Amherst Island, Magdalen Islands, on Friday night, 25th July. On Sunday night following it blew a gale from the S. E., which broke up the vessel and washed her cargo ashore, from where it was hauled up by sailors and put in safe quarters. On Tuesday, 29th inst., the cargo was sold at Auction by order of the captain, and was purchased by parties living on the Island. The cargo was of valuable pine, oak, hickory and walnut.

THE distress among the tenant farmers and farm labourers in the grazing districts of Ireland is increasing. The cattle trade from this side of the Atlantic is ruining the Irish trade. The *Freeman's Journal* says the prices were unprecedentedly low at the big fairs of Balla and Ballinasloe. Some of the wealthier landlords have reduced their rents, but the majority demand the old figure, and tenants say they cannot pay it when they have to compete with American butter at eightpence, bacon hams and beef at sixpence, and cheese at fourpence.

THE Scotch Gathering on the 15th inst., at Charlottetown, promises to be a grand demonstration. The Field and Games Committee are already busy at work. Hammers and stone of proper weight, etc., are being prepared at the Besdale Foundry. The contract for erecting the grand stand, dancing booths, etc., has been awarded to Mr. Charles McGregor. A beautiful arch, designed by Mr. Sterling, is to be erected at the entrance to the grounds, on St. Peter's Road. The committee are resolved that nothing shall be wanting on their part to make this grand national gathering, in honor of the Vice-Royal party, as imposing as possible.

THE FATE OF AN UNFORTUNATE FISHERMAN.—A despatch from Newcastle, of the 31st ult., to the *St. John Globe*, says: By advices from Bathurst, this morning, it is reported that John McIntosh, of Caraqueet, an unmarried man, before proceeding to the Caraqueet fishing grounds on Monday, visited the tavern of R. Blackhall, where he obtained liquor, of which, it is said, he partook quite freely. When out from the shore about a quarter of a mile he fell out of his boat, and, before assistance could reach him, was drowned. The body was found soon after the accident. An inquest was held before Coroner James Blackhall, when a verdict of "Death by accidental drowning" was found.
