



FRENCH ORIGINALS INSPIRE JIG-SAW GRILLE-WORK
Usually when we think of grille-work it is the lacy designs in iron to be seen on houses of the last century. The work shown in the sketch is not iron, but was jagged from pine. The repeats traced from a pattern are only 12 inches long and six wide. Note that two of these end to end are repeated on the balustrade and six on the column face. The valance repeats around the porch. The pattern used for this job shows the design on door windows, garages and fences. The pattern carries the design in actual size for carrying onto the wood, with detailed directions. Pattern number is 396 and copy will be mailed for 25c. The bidding:
North East South West
1 ♠ Pass 1 ♠ Pass
1 NT Pass 2 ♠ Pass
Opening lead—ten of clubs.
A good case can be made for South to bid two diamonds instead of two spades. He is a singleton club, the one trump contract was naturally unattractive to South, but in choosing the suit at which to play the part score contract, his decision was too arbitrary.
There are many hands which North may have that include a five card diamond suit and a doubleton spade and in such cases, the preferable trump suit is diamonds. Even in the hands where North has four diamonds and two spades, diamonds will in most cases work into the better trump suit. Where North has four diamonds and three spades, there is always the chance that North will return to spades on his own initiative. Faced with the two spade contract of his own making, South proceeded with the play in the most approved style. The reader might pause to examine South's problem and work out the solution. It is not a difficult or complicated course of play that is involved, but many experienced players might overlook the best procedure.
If South approaches the play of the hand by counting his losers, he will note that there are four heart losers, a diamond and an indefinite number of trump losers. This will make it appear that the contract is a hopeless one.
If, however, South views the play from the standpoint of the number of winners he has, he will start by counting the A-K of diamonds and the ace of clubs. If, then, he can produce five trump tricks, the hand will be made. This is the right view to take and South proceeded along these lines.
After winning the opening club lead with the ace, South trumped a club. He then led a diamond to the king and ruffed another club. A diamond now to the ace enabled him to trump dummy's last club.
Six tricks had been played and South had won them all. The ace of trump remained as solid citizens whose power could not be denied.

First Call On New Atlantic Cable Sept. 25
MONTREAL (CP) — The first transatlantic telephone call by submarine cable between Canada and the United Kingdom will take place Sept. 25. It was announced Monday by Douglas F. Bowie, president of Canadian Overseas Telecommunication Corporation.
The inaugural ceremonies start at 11 a. m. from Ottawa. Transport Minister Marler will lead a group of distinguished Canadians who will speak over a gold-plated telephone set especially manufactured for the occasion.
Mr. Marler will speak to Rt. Hon. Charles Hill, postmaster general, in London, and Cleo Craig, president of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company, in New York.
Mr. Marler will extend Canada's congratulations to the two countries who are joint owners with Canada in the \$40,000,000 project. Sir Gordon Radley, director-general of the British post office, will speak from the London end and Mr. Bowie will take the call on behalf of the Crown corporation.
A feature of the ceremonies will be the provision of 100 individual telephones for the assembled guests. They will be introduced by Mr. Bowie and invited to speak to persons at the other end.
Canada is provided with six telephone circuits in the new cable, which will also give Canada additional telegraph channels between this country and the United Kingdom. These channels will serve to develop an overseas customer-to-customer teletype service throughout the United Kingdom and Europe, scheduled to begin in November.
DAMASCUS, Syria (AP)—Syria and Lebanon have instructed their UN delegations to bring to the Security Council's attention the massing of British and French troops on Cyprus as "a threat to the peace and security" of both nations, a Syrian foreign ministry spokesman said Saturday.
