DEATH FOR SPYING DAMASCUS (Reuters) - A special Syrian military court Saturday sentenced to death Elie Cohen, one of 63 persons detained earlier this year, on charges of heading an Israeli spy ring. Strontium-90 Report Given

WASHINGTON (AP)—The national average radioactive strontium-90 content of milk edged up to 20 picocuries a litre in February after being steady at 19 the five preceding months, the Public Health Service has reported.

All levels were far below those which the Federal Radiation Council considers an acceptable health risk—200 picocuries a day, averaged over a year, for large general population groups for a lifetime.

A picocurie is one-millionth of a curie. A curie is equal to the radioactivity of one gram of radium.

Most recent available Canadian figures are for January and show a national average of 29.9 picocuries a litre, about the same as December last year.

The highest January count was 43.3 at Quebec City. Fort William was next with 39.4. Toronto was the lowest sample point with 14.2. The Canadian sample was taken at 16 points across the country.

STUNT AIMED AT CLEANUP

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (AP) Anyone picking up a discarded cigarette package on the streets of this city may find a dollar bill inside, starting May 21.

It's part of the city's annual spring cleanup campaign and the civic cleanup committee will plant \$35 in one-dollar bills in empty packages as an incentive. Officials suggest that packages picked up that don't have money in them be tossed into litter barrels, rather than back on the city streets.
