INJURED BOY AWAITS DAD'S VISIT IN VAIN

WINDSOR, Ont. (CP) — A four-year-old boy with a severe skull fracture awaits his father's daily visit to his hospital bed — a visit which has been keeping the boy happy and alive each day.
His father, a welder, was killed in a violent single-car crash early Sunday.
The boy's mother and hospital officials fear if Michael is left the tragic story of his father's death, it could be fatal.
" You be a good boy while I am away and I promise to be back again Sunday night," Michael's father told the boy before leaving for his last Saturday night.
The boy has been giving Michael hope and strength since he was critically injured three weeks ago when struck by a car.
A little note on the boy's right arm cast reads: "Daddy loves Michael and mommy cast Saturday during the last week of his life."
Mr. Bloomfield, a passenger in the car of a Detroit friend, was killed when the auto smashed into a hydro pole on busy Wyandotte Street.
The family has been plagued by misfortune for the past six years including poverty, unemployment, sickness and a death.
Mrs. Bloomfield described in an interview the problems since her family moved here.

Youth Wounded While Hunting

ST. STEPHEN, N.B. (CP) — The first hunting accident in New Brunswick in 1963 occurred when a 22-caliber rifle opened her Tuesday morning.
James Rayner, 16, of St. Stephen, was killed by a bullet from a 22-caliber rifle carried by a companion, a 17-year-old boy.
Police said the boy tripped and his rifle accidentally discharged.
The youth was taken to the Charlotte County Hospital here by a passing motorist after the boy had been shot, but he was later transferred to hospital in Saint John.
The condition is described as serious. The Charlotte County RCMP are investigating.
