Brief On Indecent Literature Presented To Canadian Senate

OTTAWA, (CP) — Government censorship of publications before distribution was suggested Wednesday as a method to control the obscene literature.

The suggestion was made in a brief to a Senate committee prepared by the Canadian Home and School and Parent-Teacher Federation.

Mr. Michael said the Seventh Day Adventist Church, with a membership of about 20,000, feels more can be gained by educating youth to good reading than by prohibitive steps.

"We would be hesitant in advocating steps to legislate in matters of morals," he said. "We strongly oppose anything that savors of government trying to dictate to individual conscience."

At the suggestion of Senator Thomas Farquhar (L-Ontario) the committee set up a subcommittee to see if the Criminal Code can be amended and how the code can be enforced by the provinces.
