Some Progress
Molotov told Bidault Wednesday, a Soviet spokesman said, that Russia is sympathetic concerning the evacuation of French wounded from the besieged stronghold of Dien Bien Phu. The spokesman said Molotov proposed that representatives of the "interested sides" in Indo-China should meet at once in Geneva if necessary, to arrange the evacuation.

A Soviet spokesman disclosed Molotov had proposed that Vietnam leaders be invited to Geneva. The French rejected this earlier proposal but were understood Wednesday night to be studying the proposal. On the evacuation of wounded from Dien Bien Phu, Bidault asserted the Vietnam have refused all pleas for a brief truce to enter French planes to take casualties out of the fortress. He said Vietnam rebels had fired on hospital planes marked with the Red Cross.

Dulles meanwhile issued a written appeal to all conference delegates to "act effectively" in seeing the evacuation of wounded is permitted by the Communists.

ASIA FOR ASIANS
At Wednesday's afternoon session, Red China's Chou En-lai, admitted to the councils of the world's major powers for the first time, called for a program of "Asia for the Asians" with foreign troops and bases banned.

In a bitter denunciation of the West, Chou ranged over a wide field. He opposed rearmament of western Germany and demanded a ban on the H-bomb. He supported the proposals laid down Tuesday by North Korea's Gen. Nam Il for settling the Korean problem.

"For the first time, the Chinese people are the real masters of their fate," he said. "No force can or will prevent China from becoming strong and prosperous."
Chou said U.S. policy in the Far East is aimed at creating an ag-

LOBSTER TRAP AND BOAT INSURANCE EXPLAINED TO FISHERMEN AT MEETING

Mr. Lee Darrach, Charlotte-town, regional appraiser of the Fishermen's Indemnity Fund, was the principal speaker at a fishermen's meeting held at Georgetown last night. In his talk, Mr. Darrach explained lobster trap and boat insurance, and the necessity of having it done before traps were placed in the water.

In this insurance scheme against storm loss, he pointed out that there was a twenty percent deductible from the total number for depreciation. The figure of twenty percent was based on the assumption that a trap would last five years.

In explaining the insurance he said that on traps with an average value of \$3.00 to \$4.00 the premium rate was 10 cents, and the rate of indemnity was 1.75 on those between \$2.00 and \$3.00, the premium rate was 7 cents, the rate of indemnity \$1.25. He pointed out

that a graduated scale was in effect on averages from \$1.50 cost per tray of \$5.00, with premiums from 5 cents to 16 cents, and indemnity from 90 cents to \$2.75.

He noted that the plan had been well received in Rustico where approximately 80 percent had taken insurance coverage.

Insurance was also available on boats, he said, whose appraised value ranged from \$250.00 to \$7,500. The premium was one percent of the appraised value. For total loss the indemnity was 60 percent of the appraised value, and for partial loss, 30 percent of the appraised value was deductible, and the indemnity was 85 percent of the loss above the 30 percent deductible.

Mr. Darrach gave a comprehensive talk on the whole scheme which clarified many points of the insurance plan.
