C. M. B. A.—The biennial convention of the C. M. B. A. of Canada opens at Quebec on the 23rd inst.

PROGRESSIVE TRURO.—It is said that \$100,000 is being spent in building operations in Truro this year.

A QUICK TRIP.—The steamer *Brace* is now racing from Port-au-Barque to North Sydney making the trip in six hours.

THE RING.—It is announced that Jim Jeffries and James J. Corbett have signed articles to box twenty-five rounds before the Lenox Club, New York. The battle is to take place within three months and men are to receive sixty per cent of the gross receipts.

A GOOD THING.—It is reported on good authority that the Oxford Woolen Co. made a good thing out of the American tariff. Before the new law went into effect some 61,000 pounds of wool were bought largely in the Maritime Provinces and stored at Vanceboro. Under the new duty a clear profit of a very handsome sum was realized on the deal.—Amherst Press.

SPEEDY TERRIL S.—A great deal of interest was felt by the St. John horsemen in the victory of Terril S. at Rigby park, Portland, on Wednesday, from the fact that the speedy pacer is owned in this city. Terril S. is by Strathmore, dam by Ajaz. He was sold last fall at auction and purchased by George Fales for \$680. Later he went lame and George W. Leavitt purchased him from Fales at considerable over the auction price, thinking correctly that the lameness was superficial. Early this summer ownership of the pacer was acquired by Mr. John E. Moore, of this city. He has won every race he has started in this season. He reduced his mark so much at Rigby that he will now have to start in the 2:12 class.—St. John Globe.

McGILL UNIVERSITY.—The Faculty of McGill University, Montreal announces that matriculation examinations, preliminary to the various courses of study, will begin Tuesday, September 6th. On that date the examination for matriculation in the faculty of law will begin. On Thursday September 15th, examinations in Art. Applied Science, and Medicine will begin, and two days later that for matriculation in Comparative Medicine and Veterinary Science will also begin. The McGill Normal School will be reopened on September 1st. Beginning September 15th, examinations for the twenty-first year entrance examinations in the Faculty of Arts ranging from \$60 to \$200 will be held at Montreal, St. John, Nfld., Halifax, Charlottetown, Kingston, Ottawa, Winnipeg, Victoria and Vancouver.

SAD DROWNING ACCIDENT.

A very sad drowning accident occurred at Groveton, N. H., on Monday afternoon, July 18th, when James A. McInnis and Francis Baldwin, both aged 20 years and employes of the Odell Paper Co, met their death while in bathing.

It appears that the mill was shut down for the said afternoon for repairs and McInnis and Baldwin went out full of spirits as usual to the nearest river to bathe. Baldwin, who could not swim like his companion, got in beyond his depth and was going down. But McInnis, who was too much of a hero to think of putting his own life in danger, seeing his peril hastened quickly to his assistance, but was caught by his drowning companion and dragged down with him. When the bodies were recovered both were clasped in each other's arms, which was a very mournful sight for those present. Both were promising young men of good character and their very sudden death is greatly mourned by their numerous friends and acquaintances. McInnis was until quite recently employed by Locke's Express, Charlestown, Mass., where he soon won the high esteem of his employes and fellow workmen, who will learn of his sudden death with much sorrow as he was a young man that was liked by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance, and much sympathy is felt in the community for his sorrowing mother, two brothers and five sisters who are left deeply mourning for the sad loss of a true affectionate son and a loving brother.

Both bodies were taken to their former homes at St. Teresa's, Prince Edward Island, for interment. May their souls rest in peace.
