

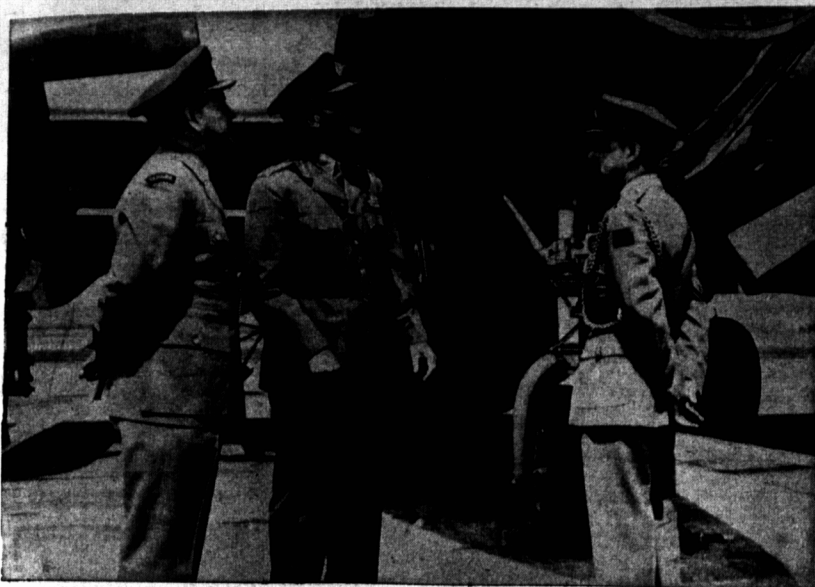

Senate Seen Focal Point If Diefenbaker Gov't Is Formed

OTTAWA (CP) — The 102-seat Senate, whose members are appointed for life at \$10,000 a year, probably will become a parliamentary focal point if a Diefenbaker government is formed as a result of Monday's stalemate election. The Progressive Conservative leader, if he comes to power, undoubtedly will make some changes, including filling the present 16 Senate vacancies. But he would still be faced with a solid core of Liberals there who would have to pass on his government's legislation.

Election Results Surprise Many Yank Officials

WASHINGTON (CP)—U.S. government officials expressed surprise at the defeat of Canada's Liberal government in Monday's national election and voiced cautious concern about the makeup of the new administration. Of immediate interest to most American officials who deal regularly with Canada were the related questions of the composition of the new cabinet, how long it will be before the new government takes office and how long it will take for political stability to return to Canada.
