

Canada's Chief Financial Institutions.

The Bank of Montreal half-yearly statement, issued last week, is a good one. The profits, as was expected, exceeded \$700,000, being \$710,815, from which is deducted \$50,000 to be expended in the erection of buildings. The bank's balance carried forward after making provision of \$50,000 for buildings and a dividend of 5 per cent, is \$51,056. The rather unusual action of setting aside \$50,000 for buildings is due to the fact that as the bank is satisfied with the half-year's business, it deemed it wise to set aside now sufficient for the contemplated buildings in Vancouver it is said. It may be said that this seems to indicate only a 1 per cent bonus for next year or 11 per cent for the year. This action is causing some comment and is doubtless the reason for the decline in stock. Over 1200 shares were sold to-day. The stock opened one-half off this morning, and declined 4 points further to 22 1/2, one broker letting some 400 shares go. The stock closed at 22 1/2.

The Parnell Commission.

While the hearing of Witnesses with reference to outrages was proceeding before the Parnell Commission on Wednesday, Sir Chas. Russell, counsel for the Parnells, complained of the bad effect that would be produced upon his client's case by parading such a great amount of crime ascribed to the action of the league, while the connection between the incriminated persons and the outrages was very slight. Presiding Justice Hanney said the commission would form an opinion upon whether persons against whom charges were made could be connected with outrages by mere proof that outrages were committed. They would be unworthy of their position if they were not able to keep their minds in a state of equilibrium upon this point. He hoped however, it would be found possible to curtail the amount of evidence of this kind. Attorney General Webster then read a long list of outrages.

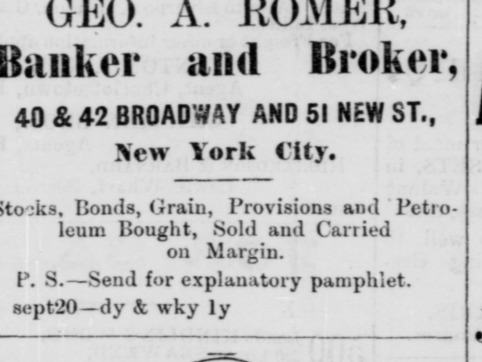
