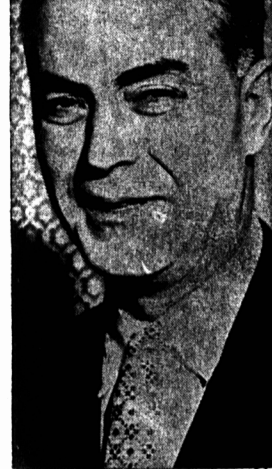


Bauer Thinks Russians Will Be Tough To Beat

TORONTO, (CP) — Bobby Bauer, coach of Canada's Olympic hockey team, refuses to panic over reports of Russian hockey power. But he readily admits the Russians will be "tough to beat" in the winter Olympic games at Cortina, Italy, next month.

Speed will be a big factor in the Jan. 25-Feb. 5 games and both Canada, represented by Kitchener - Waterloo Dutchmen, and Russia, have it.

Bauer, who has his own espionage system to scout the Russians, said in a telephone interview Tuesday from his Kitchener, Ont. home that the Russians are "pretty good."

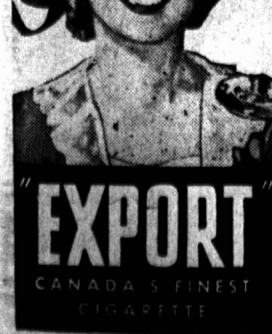
CHRISTMAS EVERYWHERE
