New Job In Sight For Dalhousie

DALHOUSIE (CP) — The second major construction project in Restigouche County will get under way at Dalhousie within the next few weeks. It was learned from Ottawa that the contract for construction of a wharf has been awarded to the Anderson Construction Co. Ltd. of Burnt Church N.B.

W.P. Anderson, an official of the company, met local officials Wednesday to discuss the project. A start will be made on the wharf "in the near future," it was said.

This follows shortly after a start of the Campbellton-Cross Point bridge. The bridge cost will total close to \$4,000,000 while the cost of the wharf will be nearly \$800,000.

Few details are yet available on the type of the wharf to be built. Officials in Ottawa said it will be one of the most modern in Eastern Canada, able to accommodate ships throughout the year.

Ice-breaker service will be available for Dalhousie during the winter months to keep ships moving freely.

The wharf is expected to provide work for a large number of men. When completed, the year-around port will mean more employment for longshoremen and other workers.
