Alive After Heart Stops Five Times

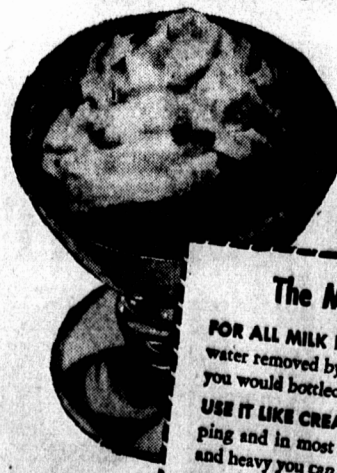
TOKYO, May 10—(AP)—Pte. Daniel N. Stoocker, 29, "died" five times last week but is still alive. The American soldier was admitted Saturday to Tokyo General Hospital with a knife wound in his heart. Doctors could find no pulse and no blood pressure. Col. N. W. Anderson, chief surgeon, began to operate. Anderson said he discovered an inch long wound in the right aorta, the chamber that receives blood from the veins. Several quarts of the blood had drained into the chest cavity. Each time he took a stitch to close the wound, Anderson said, Stoocker's heart stopped beating. Each time the doctor gently massaged the heart five minutes until it resumed beating. That happened four times. "When the stitching was all done," Anderson said, "the boy's
